Syrians in Hayti.

Port au Prince May 23.—The law directed against the Syrians, interdicting them from Commercial enterprises in the Republic of Hayti will come in force on the 31st May 1912.

All establishments not holding a special authorization will be closed forthwith.

The French Government under whose protection the Syrians were placed protested against this measure and asked for a delay of six months in Reid favour. The Haytiens being unfavourable to the Syrians have demanded with energy the putting of the law in force.

The Haitian Government, in consequence, fears great disturbances in suspending the application of the law.

Port au Prince, May 24.—The Haitian Government, in having guaranteed the payment of the creditors of the Syrians whose establishments have been closed, the French Legation has withdrawn the protest, thus; the application of the Law against Syrian Commerce in Hayti is free of all opposition.

RISE IN PRICES.

We understand that the U. F. Coy., so as to baffle the efforts of the Atlantic Fruit Coy. for this week will be by means of a tremendous rise in the price of fruit as well as by contracting with the land owners who own lands adjacent to the Railway lines to pay them a monthly rental for the roads that these small farmers use so as to prevent them bringing out their fruit to the Railway lines. In the first instance we hope that the farmers will not be foolish enough to listen to these offers because its only a means of cutting their own throats, for they must remember that as soon as they get the Atlantic out of the way they will naturally drop back to 40 cents or less. If at all, this is not the time to look for such rises, when the company is established on firm basis then we can demand prices, but to do it now would be killing the "hen that lays the golden eggs." Abide your time steady prices will come.

In the second tactic we do not believe any landowner who has a grain of sense would think of stooping so low in the eyes of the public, altho' we hear that a prominent land owner between Limon and Moin has accepted 25 dollars per month not to allow the people to pass through his farm but we are blessed in the knowledge of the fact that those properties have an allowance of two per cent left for roads included in their acreage.

The saying "Spit in the skies and it falls in your own face" is being exemplified in Limon. The U. F. Coy. has been giving the men ten colones each and sending them out the way of the Atlantic; yesterday we find them striking on the dock for 3 colones daily. This is a natural consequence of the exhibition of corruption in high places. Only two Coolies and two Jamaicans are at work in the coal boat and it is said that sufficient men cannot be had to load the fruit boat for England. Even Mr. Law's St. Kitt men are resentful at the call for labour.

Damage to Farms

The cyclone on Saturday night destroyed entirely the banana zone of the Rio Banano Division, every farmer in that vicinity has been ruined. The losses between all the farms aggregate somewhere in half a million colones. About 500,000 roots of bananas nearly all having 2 bunches worn down.

Tree Blocks Road.

An immense tree fell across the track at Bartolo on the Northern Division on Sunday night completely blocking traffic. Several gangs had to be sent to cut away the log and repair the roadbed. The Crane had also to be sent to lift and roll away the huge log. It is a pity Mr. Kirtly did not make arrangements to bring it in. It is said this tree was half way cut some time before, but for what purpose is not known.

Lindo's unfortunate letter which the company made much use of.

And now comes the news that most of the Atlantic fruit has been destroyed, we can now see the cause of all this bravado but we hope we will also see the remedy.

The President's Message.

We have learnt on very good authority that in consequence of recent happenings in and around Limon, that President Jimenez has sent a telegram to Mr. Mullins, General Manager of the Northern Railway and United Fruit Coy. of Costa Rica in which he reminds Mr. Mullins that this is a free country, free to individual and corporation alike, and that any corporation doing business here must do it in conformity with the honour of commercial interchanges. He will not therefore tolerate any waverings towards monopolies.

It is presumed therefore that it is in consequence of this message that Mr. Mullins saw the necessity of sending a letter to Mr. Wetmore on Saturday informing him that he was prepared to hand over to him the fruit of the Atlantic Company so arbitrarily taken up by his employees on the day previous.

Exodus from Town

The past week has been one of genuine activity among the labouring classes. So as to create a scarcity of labour in Limon, the U. F. Coy. has been shipping men out of town by the hundreds. Go to Siquirres you can find hundreds of men lounging around the platforms, enquire of them and they will tell you that the company sent them up there on pay, but they do not know what work they have sent to do, these men say the company has given them ten colones each to defray their expenses, given them such treatment as had never had, whisky not omitted in the bill of fare. What benefits in competition! On Sunday morning about 200 men were sent out by train, but some of these trains came in with empty cars.

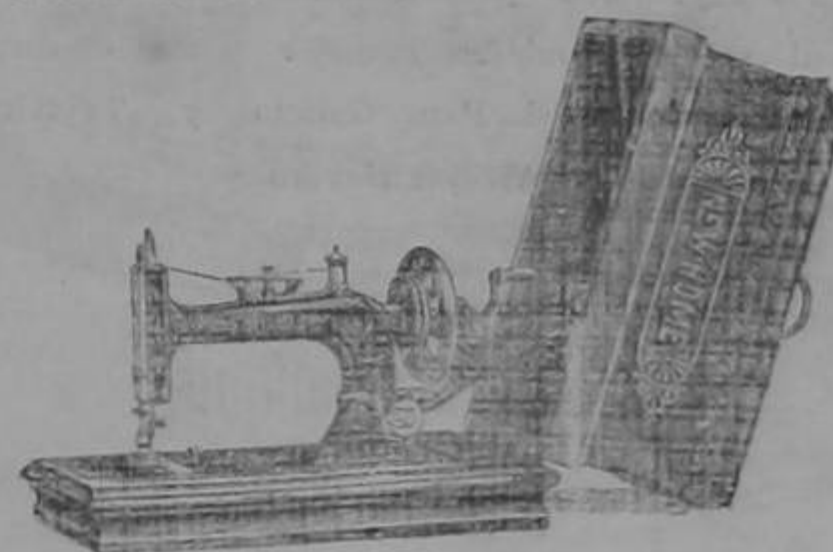

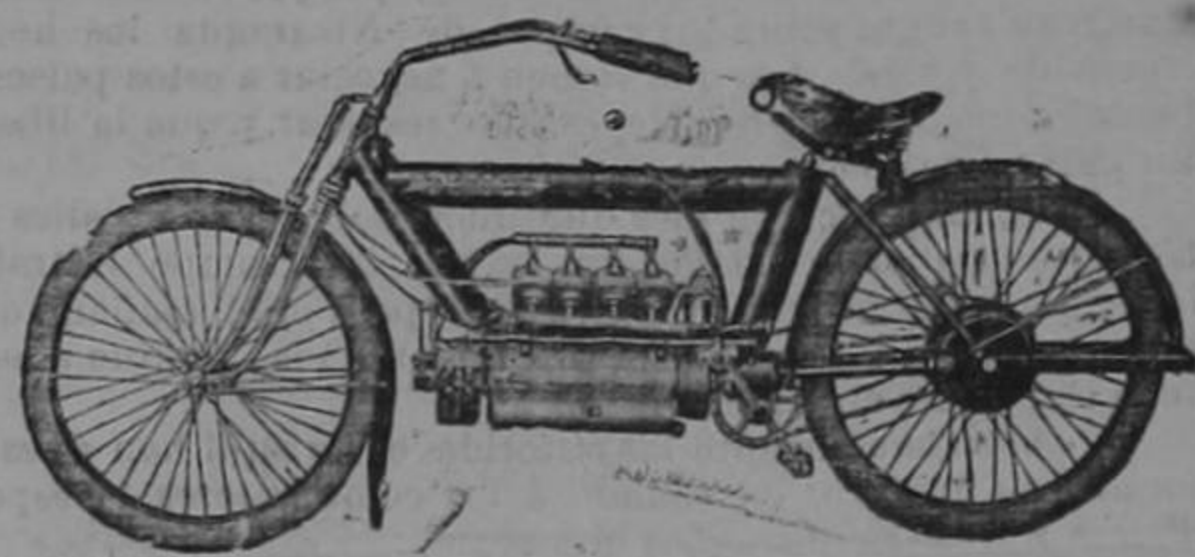
