Fué ayer una fecha gloriosa.

Ciento una vez la aurora besó las cumbres, desde el día péico que fué proclamada la independencia de uno de los pueblos más heroicos de la tierra.

Ciento una vez besó el sol las cimas borrosas del Táchira, donde por vez primera vibraron los clarines del combate, anunciando la marcha inicial de un pueblo por el sendero de la redención.

Fué un día lleno de sol. Triste estaba el rostro señudo del despotismo, presintiendo la vecindad de la epopeya libertaria, y sus garras se incaban furiosamente en lo más recóndito de los corazones preñados de cólera sagrada.

La Guardia del Pretorio erizaba de bayonetas en torno del pecho del Nerón que pugnaba inquieto por conciliar el sueño que los cachorros de la Rebelión turbara con sus bélicos rugidos de impaciencia. Comenzaba la sombra de una eterna tradición vergonzosa a lucir en grandes por la conciencia popular que iniciaba por primera vez el sacudimiento del letargo enervante que se apoderaba de los pueblos oprimidos.

De repente un rumor de amanecer selvático que ascendía de la calle llenó tumultuosamente las habitaciones del César: los cachorros de la Rebelión habían despedazado sus cadenas. El César corrió presuroso las cortinas: los horizontes estaban incendiados; un hombre apareció sobre su caballo de batalla y á su paso, las campanas de la Libertad tocaban arrebato.

Francisco Miranda había rasgado á golpes de ala la inmovilidad del alma colonial; el imperio de Castilla sentí aconmovidos sus simientos por los primeros tumbos del mar revolucionario. La lucha fué tenaz, implacable y sangrienta; de un lado la avanzada irresistible de un pueblo ebrio del otro, el batallar férreo de los heroicos legionarios del Reino Rodó Miranda, surgió Bolívar... así en desfile interminable fueron sucediéndose los cíclopes y fueron brotando termópilas. Después, el sol que sucedió á la noche de la lucha, alumbró sobre el campo de batalla al despotismo, tendido en cruz sobre los pedazos de su escudo...

...Ya esos tiempos pasaron. Las sombras han vuelto á descolgar sus cortinajes sobre la patria de Bolívar, los senderos gloriosos han sido hollados nuevamente por el corcel del despotismo... en tanto, qué hacen los cachorros de la revelión? Serán impotentes esta vez? Esperemos... Rivas Vaquez los amaestra.

El conflicto frutero

Hemos sabido que la United Fruit Company para entorpecer el acarreo de la fruta comprada por la Atlantic ha cercado todas sus fincas, inclusive los callejones que por ley deben estar expeditos y que sirven de camino para todo el que quiera transitar por ellos; callejones que la primera de las Compañías citadas ha venido disfrutando *ad libitum*, es decir como le ha dado la gana.

El supremo Gobierno ha mandado que se abran aquellos como lo indica el plano respectivo, debiendo procederse inmediatamente y enviando ingenieros al efecto para que practiquen las medidas: por supuesto que esta disposición no será del agrado de Mr. Mullins, ó sea de la United Fruit Company, pero á nosotros nos ha complacido tanto que no podemos menos que exclamar:

¡Muy bien don Ricardo!

Lo hecho no es aún suficiente para que las cosas queden en su verdadero lugar, la obra emprendida no debe quedar á medias. En ninguna de las escrituras que contienen los contratos de concesión de la línea férrea ni aún en la primitiva, se ha establecido que la faja de que debía disponer la compañía á ambos lados del enriellamiento, á contar del eje central, fuera de cincuenta pies, sino de treinta, y si no nos equivocamos, respetado derechos de terceros, en ciertos lugares aun de menos cantidad: pero la Compañía, haciéndose *la sueca* ha venido sosteniendo que le corresponden 50 pies, y todo aquel que ha fabricado un rancho en el exceso que ella se ha apropiado estaba y está irremisiblemente condenado á pagar los sabrosos para ella derechos de piso; y nadie la saca de esa *cancioncilla*.
La faja á ambos lados del Ferrocarril está dividida en cuatro partes, á saber: 30 pies concedidos al ferrocarril para las obras necesarias á esa empresa, que no pueden ser otras que estaciones y switches; veinte pies para camino ó carretera; treinta y ocho pies para los que quieren construir casas ó ranchos, y doce pies para evitar que los fondos de esas casas toquen con las empalizadas de las fincas, y á la vez pueda transitarse por esas fajas. Cantidad total de pies á ambos lados de la vía, desde el eje central: cien—eso ha cumplido con esa división prescrita en los contratos y escrituras acerca de la materia?—

¿Llegará la United Fruit á oponerse á las desiciones que el Gobierno ponga en práctica respecto del asunto? He aquí el conflicto. El Código Civil al tratar de la prescripción lo hace de manera general, es decir, que ella corre tanto para los bienes de particulares como para los de la nación; y no dudamos que haya quien aconseje á la United Fruit Company que agarre á este recurso. Creemos que el Poder Ejecutivo, reformando el Código citado, debe enviar al Congreso un decreto por el cual esas fajas de terreno, callejones y cualesquiera otros caminos de la República, sean inalienables, como se hizo con la Milla Marítima; y que al ser ley entre en Vigencia inmediata, ó que ha dicha disposición se le dé carácter retroactivo.

Recordamos que no ha muchos días un estimable Colega de la Capital, preguntaba si la Compañía ahora tendría derecho para el embargo de esa fruta, ó debía concretarse á los cultivos ó fincas de los vendedores. En nuestro concepto lo llevado á cabo son arbitrarios: la Atlantic á comprado frutos á finqueros que se dicen ser dueños de la fruta vendida, y la compañía dejaron al lugar destinado para el embarque, de manera que ha hecho una compra feita: el recurso ha debido establecerlo la Compañía, si se creía con derecho, contra los vendedores, en sus bienes ó cultivos, por medio de un juicio de rescisión por falta de cumplimiento de estos á los respectivos contratos que con ella han celebrado. El embargo de la fruta hubiera procedido estando ella dentro de sus respectivas fincas.

Visto el Punto bajo otro aspecto: en los Contratos privados que celebó la United Fruit con los finqueros, si no estamos mal informados, *La Compañía se obliga á comprarles toda la fruta que produzcan las fincas*, y quien no sabe que al estar colocada la fruta en las plataformas, los recibidores apartan los racimos que califican de primera y de segunda y desechan todos los demás que no estiman en tales condiciones, causando enormes pérdidas á los dueños en este sentido? ¿Quién no sabe que segun el mayor ó menor expendio del fruto en los Estados Unidos la Compañía manda limitar la cuota á los finqueros, perdiéndose así también gran cantidad de fruta que han puesto á disposición de la Compañía? ¿Quién ignora que por un «quitame allá esas pajas» que tuviera un finquero con cualquiera superintendente era motivo para que no se le recibiera fruta?

Si los finqueros por el contrato privado con la Compañía estaban obligados á venderle toda la fruta y han tenido que soportar la pérdida referida, hoy se les presenta la oportunidad de rescindirlos y aún reclamarle á esa Empresa los perjuicios que les ha ocasionado.

Esperemos la decisión de los Tribunales.

PERSONAL

Esta señora recibió el miércoles en la tarde la noticia de que en Alajuela acaba de morir repentinamente un hermano suyo, y á esahora preparó su viaje para el día siguiente; al embarcarse en el tren el día jueves, recomendó á su esposo para que le comprara el tiquete, pero la aglomeración en la taquilla, impidió á este señor comprarlo á tiempo, y el tren partió llevándose á la señora sin dinero y sin tiquete.

El sargento Umaña pasó á la oficina del Ferrocarril y dejó en poder de uno de los empleados (Mr. Ownes) el valor del pasaje, para que este señor enviara un telegrama á Moin, explicando lo ocurrido al conductor del tren.

El telegrama fué puesto inmediatamente, pero no obstante esto, el conductor obligó á la señora á bajarse en Moin, sin hacer caso de los ruegos de esta, que entre otras cosas le ofreció un espejo como garantía mientras llegaba á San José, donde le entregaría el valor del pasaje.

Esto, á ojos vista, es un acto muy poco humanitario, y muy

poco cortés, porque se trataba de una señora, que por casualidad se encontraba sin su tiquete.

Nosotros creemos, que aunque sean empleados del ferrocarril, los individuos, que por su empleo tienen que rosarse con el público, debían saber tratar con las señoras y debían tener el criterio un poco más amplio para comprender, que en estos casos, el empleado debía, hasta donde le sea posible, hallar las dificultades que en casos como el presente, pongan á una señora en la necesidad extrema de ofrecer garantía por una suma tan pequeña.

Pero es cosa bien sabida, que el arma oficial de ciertas compañías es la falta absoluta de cultura y de humanidad; y es natural, que los empleados subalternos, traten de halagar á sus jefes.

Nosotros nos permitimos poner en conocimiento de los altísimos empleados del ferrocarril este incidente, quizá ellos como caballeros que son, quieran darle una pequeña lección de cultura á este empleado, peligroso en verdad para toda señora que tenga necesidad de viajar.

Reports have reached this office that during the past week, hundreds of men were employed by the U. F. Coy. as watchmen and runners through out the Atlantic Zone, all well armed.

Is this permissible by law? At times you hear the police prohibiting the carrying of weapons and yet in these times we find some of the most irresponsible, unreliable men—men who are incapable to use their discretion, carrying arms along the Railroads in numbers; why, you do ask? sent by the U. F. Coy. to protect their bananas in places that they have none. Can the Government not intervene? If there are to be watch men let them be men of good judgement and morals, but not any labourer picked up on the farms and paid special prices, men who are only too willing to criminate themselves on the slightest pretext without the authority—how much more with the authority.

A Sergeant of the Police Force, a very reliable man, lodged a most serious complaint at this office on Thursday morning to the effect that his wife Señora Dolores Umaña who got information that her brother in Alajuela met a violent death at that place, boarded the train at the last moment while he went to secure her ticket, but before being able to get back to her the train left the station. 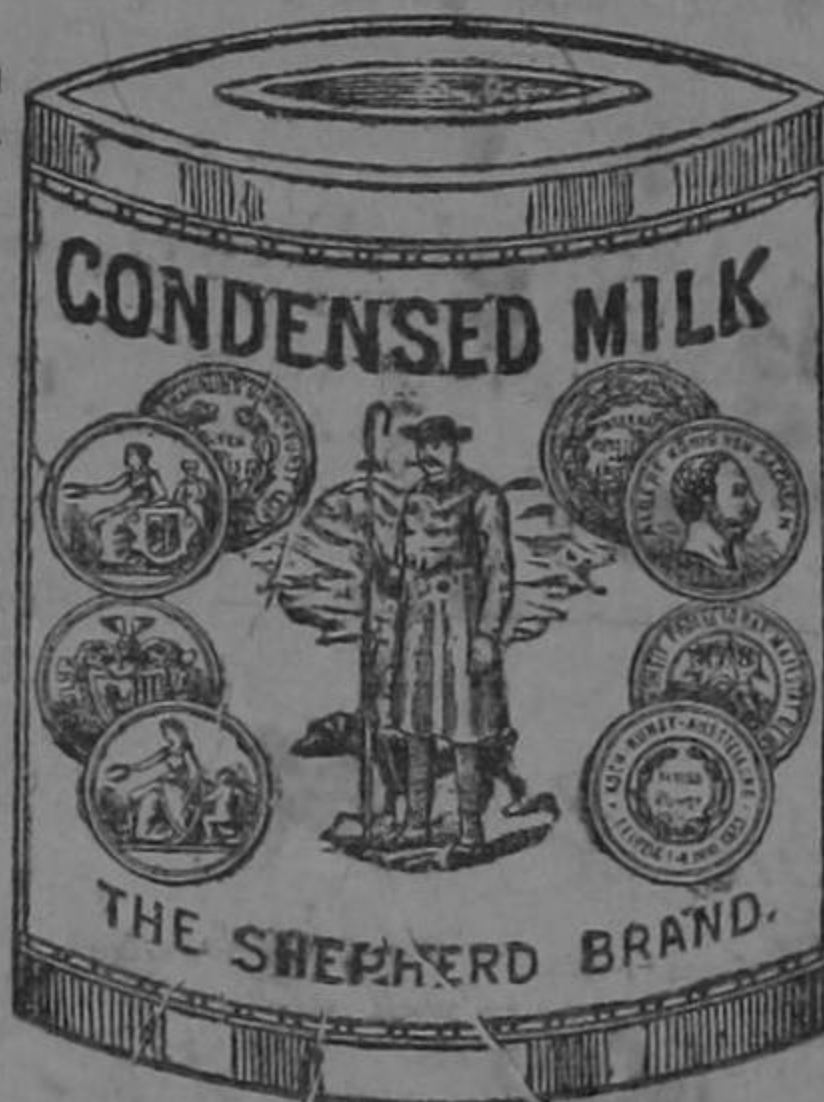

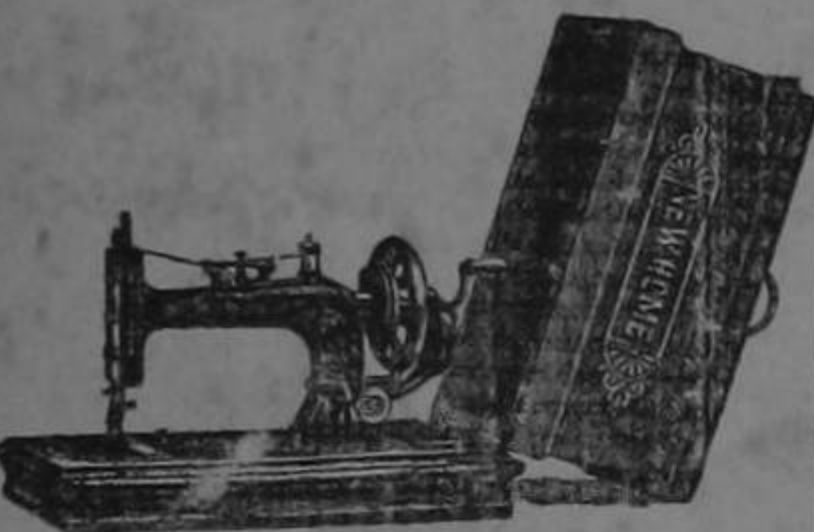

FOURTH JULY.

If there is a day in the lives of true Americans of which they are proud and rightly they may, it is the memory of the 4th of July 1783, the day on which the fate of millions of people was decided, and on which a turning point towards freedom in speech and action to a people whom we unhesitatingly say are the most ambitious today on the face of the globe was marked—the day on which ceased once and let us say for all the spilling of the blood of true relatives by each other the day when it never before the nobles of the British Parliament must have felt to the core the force of that memorable speech of Earl of Chatham. Therefore we say rightly ought every true American to be proud of the glories achieved on that Historic day, but we feel that the younger Americans does not vie with that amount of honour the annual arrival of that day. Formerly even in far away Costa Rica the dawn of that glorious 4th would mean unceasing rejoicing to the Americans here but now had it not been for the interesting activity of their genial Consul, Mr. Chester Donaldson, one would forget that such a day has arrived that prompt ceremony with which the day should be greeted seem to give place to individual revelry and tends to underestimate in the eyes of the world at large the importance of this day. The month of July on the whole seem to be a month of surprises—a month for pacific negotiations. We find the 4th of July the Independence of the United States of America, 5th that of Venezuela, 14th that of the French, 20th that of Colombia, 22nd that of Ecuador, 28th that of Peru, and then we find the cloud bursting on the 6th August when the five South American Republics finally drove out the Spanish Arms by the defeat of their 70,000 men and came to a definite understanding among themselves. Hence the month of July ought to have a peculiar sentiment to America and Americans and North Americans ought to treat the memory of 4th July as the honour of the day deserves.

Offensive Dwelling

Interesting Inter-View with Mr. Cecil Lindo.

Lindo Fruit Coy. Will Come.

Don Cecilio Lindo was also a visitor to Limon on Thursday. Ever since the banana storm burst in Costa Rica this has been his first visit here. We had a pretty lengthy interview with Mr. Lindo, at first stormy, but after settling down to business. He avowed that he is not fighting with the Atlantic Fruit Coy., but they with him, for all that he is demanding of them is to deposit the three million dollars and take over his farms, but up to this they have done nothing. When asked if he had any explanation to offer in consequence of the declarations of Mr. Di Giorgi as appeared in the "Gleaner" and reproduced in the TIMES, Mr. Lindo said he did not think he had much more to offer, because the intelligent interpretation of Mr. Di Giorgi's declaration tended to prove that he was perfectly correct in his attitude because Mr. Di Giorgi admitted having deriated from the arrangements made by them and substituted a secondary plan which did not meet his approval, and that rather than be fooled and played with, he entered into negotiations for forming the Lindo Fruit Coy. which he hopes to start operations within two months from now. Mr. Lindo further stated that Mr. Di Giorgi's actions today prove the accuracy of his statements, that the money could not be found to meet his price which Mr. Di Giorgi did not want the world to know, hence the lawsuit, to throw him in a bad light, but it is evident that if they had the money it would have been lodged and the farms taken, but he wants to see the colour of their money first.

He also informs us that he will leave Costa Rica for Toronto either on the 15th or 22nd of this month to arrange certain final details of his Lindo Fruit Coy., but will be back from Canada in about six weeks when he will start operations immediately on behalf of the Lindo Fruit Coy. for which he has already bought nearly 3,000 hectares of land which he will give out to responsible parties on good terms to cultivate. He prefers to give out these land to industrious men to cultivate and buy their fruit rather than to cultivate himself but he intends to plant one thousand hectares as soon as he returns. In the Bananita run he has bought 450 hectares at a cost of 45,000 colones, in the Parismina division he has bought 1250 hectares for 175,000 colones and in the Nos Norillos and Rio Frio Divisions he has bought 1250 hectares for 125,000 colones besides he has bought a beautiful site in the front street. San Jose on which his Bank will be erected and this he says will be no petty bank either, but rather with a capital of probably five millions by which he will be able to help small settlers to cultivate their farms properly. When asked his relationship to the U. F. Coy. as far as competition was concerned, Mr.

Obstruction Camp Again.

The 'Obstruction Camp' is out again, off again, and we hope will soon be back again, as futile again.

We understand Major McConnell is ordered front again, and that our friend Don Carlos is again gone to watch "land" cutting his fruit.

Gen. Van Scriber says he hopes Col. Merrill will come back again to his division this week as he gave him good luck last week, for he nearly doubled his purchases while his men watched the fruit for him.

Personal

Mrs. Caridad de Lindo was a most welcome visitor to Limon again after several years sojourn in Europe and America. She arrived by the s.s. Tivives on Thursday and left on Friday morning in company with her two children for San José where she will spend a few days among her people and embark again for Europe, taking the two children to school. The entire community was pleased to welcome her home along with her favourite sister, Miss Belen Quesada.

Lindo said it was not his idea to wage a competitive war against that Coy. because he was going to plant and buy bananas to sell to the Elders and Fyffe's Steamship Coy. which was a friendly company to the U. F. Coy. in a similar manner as he considered the U. F. Coy. was to the Lindo Fruit Coy., but that he would be buying fruit from his own customers at the current prices paid by the United or any other company.

Mr. Lindo wished it distinctly understood that he was not doing anything to hamper the Atlantic Fruit Coy. (which he could very well do if he wanted to) because through him they had come here, but he was only demanding of them the fulfilment of their obligations with him, but he could not help expressing that he thought they were adopting measures for their establishment which he did not think very sensible for the administration of a large business Corporation, he thought they would have done something more tangible such as buying a few farms giving real help to the man with his ten or twenty hectares of bananas and such like. Neither did he approve of the tactics of the U. F. Coy. in suppressing the delivery of fruit; as they should have got good men to locate the owners of fruit and contract they themselves, and insist on their carrying out the terms of their contract or close them up instead of running about now and fussing with the Atlantic Fruit Coy.

On the strength of this interview, if the Atlantic gets established on a firm basis which we hope she will do, then we cannot but feel that Costa Rica has a glorious future before her, due to the development of the fruit trade, and to the farmers we will say stand firm for competition and do not compromise yourselves yet to any one, if the Atlantic wants business she will naturally make solid business propositions to you, which we feel sure Mr. Wetmore will soon see his way to do, or—

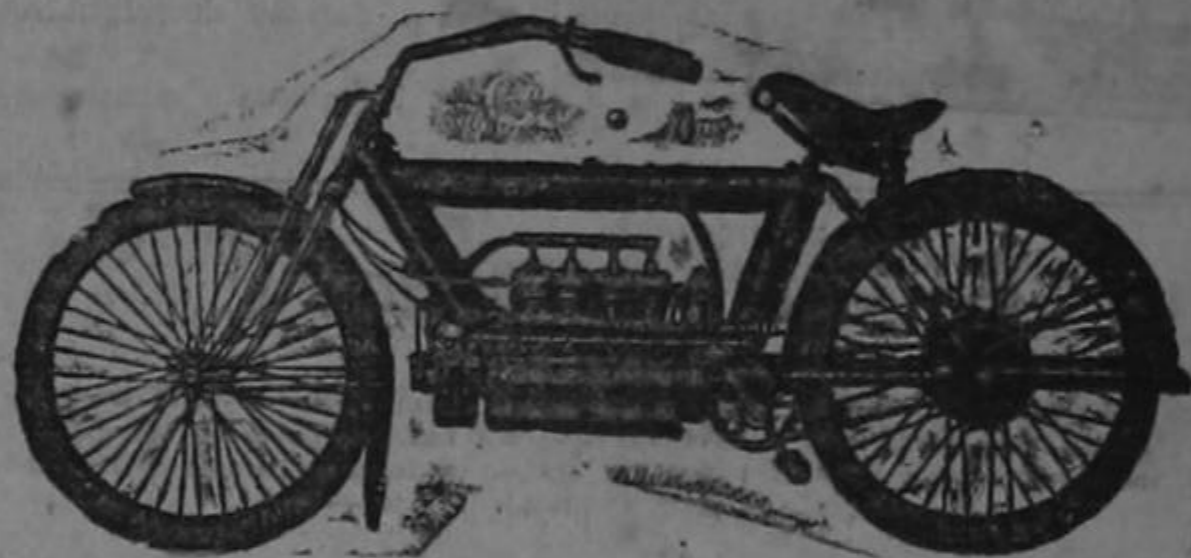
