Embargo Coach

The embargo coach went out as usual at noon to embargo the fruit bought by the Atlantic Fruit Coy. On Friday the farm of Mr. Xirinachs was embargoed and eleven small cultivators who have been working on this land, have also had an embargo put against their cultivations at the instance of the company, it is said, hence they cannot cut fruit for the Atlantic Fruit Coy. Mr. Farrer is said to be Depositario of these farms.

Obstruction Camp

This is supposed to be the last week that there will be any necessity for the obstruction camp, because the farms that they were supposed to be watching have all signed contracts now; that is the Pardo farm and Veronica Ville, property of the Misses Eunis, hence Mr. Land will have to deliver all the fruit cut or these farms to the U. F. Coy. by virtue of their agreements.

Heavy Rains.

The heavy rains on Friday night last, held up every train in the yard until morning. The entire city was under water, some of the establishments were inundated, lots of goods in some of these establishments got spoiled; in some parts of the town there were 3 feet of water in the streets. The Rail way track was in some places under water along the Camp One division for 2 feet, but fortunately it ran away quickly so that no damage was done, apart from a little scouring here and there. For years we have not witnessed such a continuous down pour, the average could not be less than 15 inches for the night.

El 14 de Julio

Es el 14 de julio la fiesta universal que conmemora la epopeya más grande que registran los pueblos y las naciones. En ese día sagrado, la magestad del pueblo se elevó sobre la magestad de los tronos, y la sangre de los tiranos rodó en ondas purpúreas sobre los blancos mármoles de los palacios, manchando los cuellos azules de las altivas princesas, y después, al caer de la tarde y en la muerte del sol, dejó su Arco-Iris rojo en las nubes errantes del ocaso.

—En días pasados partió para San José la Comisión nombrada por el Supremo Congreso, para investigar el conflicto pendiente entre las Compañías bananeras. Nos dicen personas que nos merecen entero crédito, que por disgustos suscitados entre ellos, han dejado de cumplir con el compromiso adquirido. Alguno de los señores de la Comisión, según nos afirman, pretende hacer creer que los agricultores que tienen en arriendo tierras de la United Fruit Co., están en la obligación de venderle a ella (la United) todo el producto de las tierras, aunque no exista contrato para ello. Quisieramos saber nosotros, en qué funda este señor esa creencia? de cuándo acá, y en qué país existe esa ley que obliga al inquilino de una finca a vender todos sus productos al propietario de la tierra sin que entre los dos medie ningún contrato que le obligue? Porque la United Fruit, si no recibe todo el banano que se le ofrece, impide al agricultor vender el banano que ella arroja por malo.

Pero hay una cosa más grave que todo esto, y es la poca ó ninguna importancia que la Comisión a prestado a los asuntos que ha venido aquí a resolver, y que según nuestro criterio, son bien fáciles de allanar, porque ninguno de los contratos que los agricultores tienen con la United, está escrito en papel sellado y en español, requisitos ambos, indispensables para que sean válidos, en este ó en cualquiera otro país donde las leyes así lo ordenen.

Stupid Methods

Mr. Editor:—Permit me space in your valuable columns to express myself relative to the happenings of the past two or three weeks.

The residents of Estrada have been witnessing the most childlike operations that is possible to the most ignorant. From time to time since the A. F. Coy. started operations here we have seen hundreds of men belonging to the U. F. Coy. armed, some running on motor cars, some on horse back, other on foot, watching honest people selling their fruit. The cause of this is from the utter foolishness of the tactics of the Hitchcock Administration of the U. F. Coy. due to inspection of farms on special trains and refusing to give industrious men contracts for their fruit, meanwhile lazy chaps who may be in favour with some one in office, get a contract and make a living off those who will cultivate, by shipping all their fruit in his name without probably owning a root himself. The company never sent a man to find out where these fruit are coming from, hence they really do not know who own the fruit. Now that the A. F. Coy comes in the market, the grower sells his fruit direct and Mr. Speculator has none to give, the U. F. Coy do not grasp the situation and acknowledge their foolishness in the past, but they are spending thousands of dollars to find out why Mr. Speculator allows his fruit to be sold else where; having hundreds of men to patrol the district and molest peaceable men like a pack of highway robbers; but on Saturday last we were pleased to see the big U. F. Coy's bluff completely baffled and disarmed and a small man challenged him to do his most but he was at sea and thought discretion the better part of valor.

We hope to see the Jamaican farmers striking out for their rights, by which the natives of the country as grateful men will have another mark of gratitude to put to the score of the Jamaican, as had it not been for the efforts of the Jamaican planter the Atlantic could never get a footing in Costa Rica for we see Americans, Englishmen, Frenchmen, Barbadians, and Natives all fighting against the interests of the prosperity of Costa Rica, but by our united efforts we hope soon to see the A. F. Coy. well established to our mutual good.

came in with the Commission. Immediately the bustle and confusion started; we hustled to the spot to see what was doing, on going we learnt that the fruit was embargoed in Siquirres by the U. F. Coy. and raised by the Atlantic F. Coy. and re-embargoed by themselves and now we see it being re-embargoed by the U. F. Coy. Mr. Marshall was named Depositario by the A. F. Coy., when the U. F. Coy's lawyer objected to him and named Mr. Kirtley, which was also objected to by the acting Judge Don Carlos Orozco Amador, and Mr. Lorig from Siquirres named by him as Receiver. Now this was the strangest piece of manipulations possible, how completely the Judge played into the hands of the U. F. Coy. will be seen from the fact that Mr. Lorig came along apparently asked to be there, and by all reasonings by whom could he have been asked? Would it not have been better judgment to have asked Don Lucas Alvarado to be receiver? The fruit was of course handed over to the U. F. Coy. and shipped that night. The most interesting incident in the whole affair was to see Don Lucas in the attitude of prayer when signing his name to the document, we could not help wondering how often he found himself in that posture and how many of the conspirators around ever stop to pray for the injustice being done to the small farmers, the Atlantic Fruit Coy. and the industrial conditions of the country.

We really believe that the lawyer of the Atlantic Fruit Coy. had something up his sleeves by which he was going to undo the entire proceedings, but were surprised to find that he did nothing except to name a man who was already rejected as Receiver meantime there were men like Mr. Scott, Capt. Simmonds, and the like around, however such is the intricacies of the law.

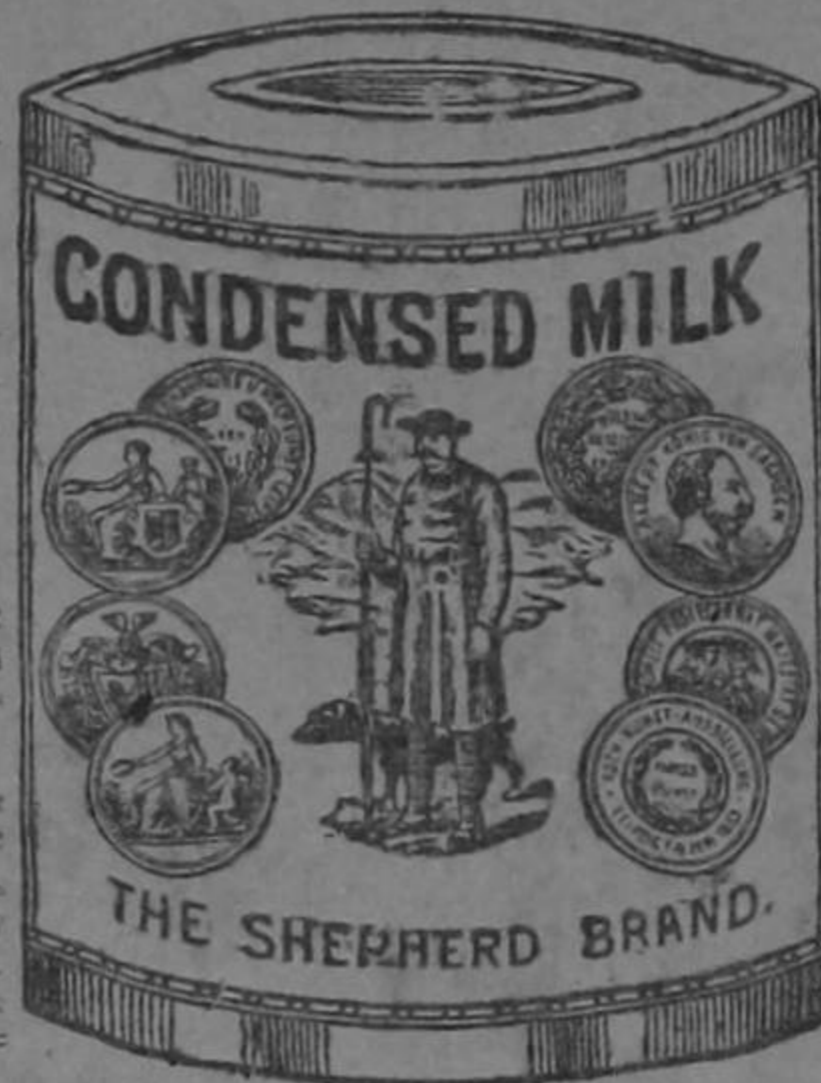

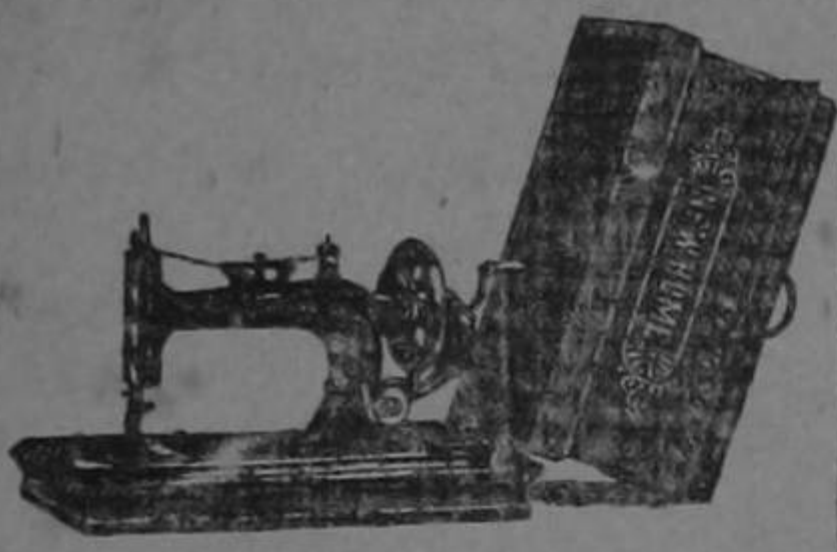

PATRIOTIC HONOUR.

However odious and distasteful comparisons may appear, yet when the needs of comparisons arise, one has to make them, fearless of the displeasure which he may feel certain of incurring. There is possibly not more than fifty Frenchmen in Limon, and at that, not of the most wealthy or influential as a whole, yet one could not help being struck at the solidity and the intensity of their concentration in the celebration of the 14th July. Our comparison was therefore drawn to the luke-warmness of the display shown by Britishers in this country from time to time on the occasions of our festive days. There are in Limon about 15,000 British Subjects and yet when occasions arise by which we can show our loyalty and patriotism, apart from the efforts of a few influential Jamaicans, nothing is done to attract the attention and admiration of the people with whom we move, or to give an example of the exhibition of intellect the possession of which, our Empire seem to boast second to none. Of course in the first place we have to blame the Government of our Empire in not seeing the necessity for sending here as Vice Consul a man who would be in a position to protect the interest of Britishers and uphold the honour and integrity of the Empire and thereby command that amount of respect which his office merits for him.

We have as our present Vice Consul a man whom no one dare cast any insinuations at, so far as his genteel deportment is concerned, but how on earth can the British Government expect him to discharge his duties impartially is beyond one's conception. This gentleman is an American, employed to an American Corporation, which employs thousands of British subjects who clash from time to time in legal points with the employers of our Vice Consul, which renders his position a truly awkward one, for he is called upon at times by his Coy. to subject the people whom he is supposed to protect to the utmost rigour of the law, which has caused him to be ridiculed by the lower order of people who can not understand that they ought to sympathize with, rather than to scourge him. He has resigned the position more than once and yet Mr. Cox will not free him, much to the people's detriment as well as his own. What does Mr. Cox mean to say, he cannot find a responsible Britisher here free from the trammels of Governmental or Corporation ties on whom to confer this honourable position? Let us suggest a few to him, we have Mr. O. P. Nunes, Mr. Sam Lindo, Mr. F. Gordon; and if he does not care for Britishers then let us suggest Mr. Lasker or Mr. Frank Maduro; we are sure if any of these will accept the position, that they would command respect and carry out the duties of Consul in an honourable and efficient manner

creditable to the Crown its subjects and themselves, so that when such occasions as our Empire Day and King's Birthday come by, our Representative may enhance that amount of enthusiasm among even those Englishmen and Canadians who would like to feel themselves Americans in Costa Rica, and so rouse them to exhibit that loyalty and love of country which he has the right to infuse in the West Indian, rather than the West Indian in him.

Let Mr. Cox awake from slumber and do justice to the flag and her subjects and appoint some one who was not to hide when called upon to protect a Britisher whether he be a white man or a "nigger," for this indifference is meted out to white men as well as negroes. We remember when Mr. Mullins prevented young Cotton an English machinist from going way and subjected him to insults by searching his baggage for a watch that was supposed to have been stolen after finding nothing he compelled Cotton to return to work after signing a contract to surrender his passage money he was dismissed from service as soon as the money was paid. What could the poor Consul do? It was a Costa Rican who compelled them to return poor Cotton his passage home to England. This could not have occurred if our Consul was independent of the Company and a man of honour and self respect.

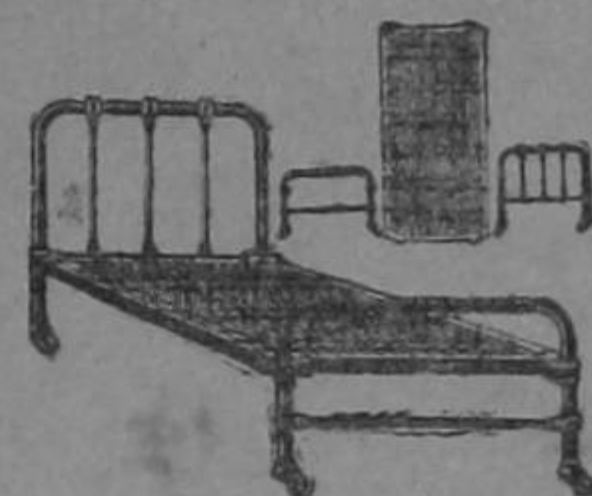

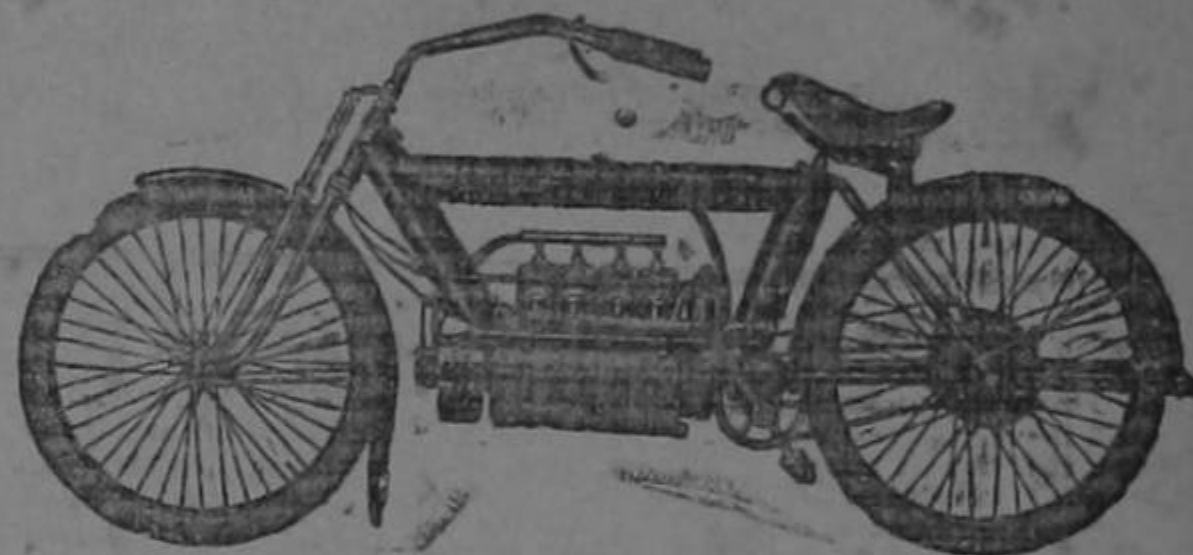
