## Who is to Blame?

Mr. Editor:

Sir.—Since the beginning of the "banana war" here, much has appeared in the TIMES setting forth the methods and doings of the United Fruit Co., but I notice you have not received many letters from the readers of the paper. This however must not be taken to mean disinterestedness on the part of fruit growers in particular, and the public in general. The whole Atlantic zone is watching with feverish anxiety to see the outcome of the battle, so much of prosperity or otherwise depends on whether or not the Atlantic Fruit and Shipping Coy. gets a foothold in Costa Rica. Now Mr. Editor if they are to get that foothold, we must give them every assistance we can, in spite of all that is being said and done by the United Fruit Coy. There are many today who are a bit uncertain how to act, for their faith is not firm that the Atlantic will not be forced to leave Costa Rica. Now, I am not connected in any way with the Atlantic, nor do I boast of the honour of knowing what is happening behind the scene, but I do know a few things, and I do not want the small cultivators to be intimidated by all the tall talk that goes the round, about the Atlantic Fruit Coy. being so financially embarrassed as to be unable either to pay for the farms under option of Messrs. Lindo Bros. or to cultivate their own farms here. With your permission therefore Mr. Editor, I want to cast a bird's eye view over the whole situation, touching on all the facts in connection with the advent of this new company.

(The coming of the Atlantic Fruit Coy.) All the banana growers owe a debt of gratitude to Mr. C. V. Lindo for setting forth the possibilities of the Costa Rican Banana Trade to the Directors of the Atlantic. We deplore all the more therefore the lawsuit that followed Mr. Lindo's dealings with them. We have all read the statements of both parties and—well candidly we feel that there is something in favour of Mr. Lindo as well as of Mr. Pi-Giorgio. But it is not my purpose to go into that lawsuit. We deplore it, and chiefly so, because every independent banana grower in Costa Rica has felt the pinch of the yoke. Mr. Lindo complained about the treatment of the United Fruit Coy. What must the small cultivator say? And the unfortunate smaller man who happened to have no contract? As I intend to travel the whole ground, (if you will give me space in your paper), I need not now tell of all the grievances of the small and smaller men. They are legion. The U. F. Coy.'s official says to the small man today: "Make contracts with my company today. The Atlantic can't stay, they have no money, etc., and when they go you will be at the

mercy of the United Fruit Co." We say to such that the small man can never be treated worse in Costa Rica. Less than 40 cents currency a bunch for bananas and at the mercy of arbitrary receivers! Never! And even when he gets contracts he gets only a certain cutting and sometimes only once a week and he cannot handle his fruit. Mr. Lindo felt none of this pinching, but we are all glad that he felt the pinch so much that he made representations to the Atlantic to come to Costa Rica—"and they come"—and they mean to stay, and they will receive the assistance and support of all banana growers. We are not going to be frightened by the bogeys and scarecrows the U. F. Coy. are exhibiting. Does any one think that the United was going to spend all the money they are now spending to oust the new company and not regain it here, if that company was driven away? Are we not seeing enough of their methods today to understand the kind of people with whom we have to deal? Myself a West Indian, I ask West Indians especially to stand by the Atlantic. No ingratitude here to the U. F. Coy., for if we have got anything from them, they have got much more from us.

We see among us then this new company. I was very much interested in your interview with Mr. C. V. Lindo but a couple of things puzzled me after reading it. Mr. Lindo stated to you that he was not hampering the Atlantic in any way, now is that true? I am tempted to ask Mr. Lindo if that is the truth in all sincerity. Is he then ignorant of the part played by his Superintendents and others connected with the firm against the Atlantic? were these things done with him protesting? If he is not hampering the Atlantic, considering he was influential in bringing them here (never mind the present lawsuit) let him call off his men at once and leave the Atlantic a bit freer to battle. Had the United treated the growers here with ordinary fairness and courtesy they would not have been genuinely hated as they are today. I can assure them—perhaps their nest is so big that the information is valueless—that there is no love to spare on the part of the banana growers towards them, and they have themselves to blame. Promises of reform are late. They ought to have come before, and then we have no guarantee that they will be permanent or even carried out should they have the monopoly. We hail the new company and shall do all we can to help her with us.

## La banda militar

En todos los tonos y de todas maneras hemos suplicado a quien corresponde que hagan algo en favor de la banda militar de esta provincia que ha llegado por desgracia a la categoría bien triste de murga, pero nuestra voz, como todo lo que pasa, se ha perdido siempre en el vacío.

Es lamentable el estado actual de los instrumentos y del aúdio, porque aquellos, apenas si produce sonidos, y porque este es lo más deficiente y lo más antiguo que se conoce en los anales de la música.

Nosotros sabemos que de estas deficiencias nos son culpables, ni el director actual, señor Barrionuevo ni los músicos, pero sabemos también que no es posible sacar adelante ninguna obra musical, por sencilla que sea, con esta clase de obstáculos.

Sabemos que el señor Barrionuevo se ha dirigido varias veces al Ministerio de Guerra, solicitando algunos instrumentos que son de absoluta necesidad, sin

que se le haya prestado atención de ninguna clase.

Nosotros no podemos creer que el señor Ministro, con el elevado criterio que lo distingue, esté enterado de estas cosas, creemos más bien, que los empleados inferiores del Ministerio, por un descuido hayan difundido estas notas.

Es lamentable en verdad, que los turistas vean en el primer puerto de la República una banda como la actual, porque ello demuestra, en primer lugar, poco gusto artístico de parte del público que oye, y en segundo, porque había poco bien de los encargados de la dirección de estas cosas.

sonas 6 sociedades contratantes aprontan las legales responsabilidades moral y comercial de cada una. Y esa condición es una urgencia, esa necesidad es una obligación cuando se trata de conceder privilegios en nombre de un pueblo cuyos intereses hay que guardar por deber altísimo. En Inglaterra como en todas las naciones importadoras de Europa y de América, hay Agencias de Información a las cuales los bolivianos y neozelandeses acuden en guarda de sus propios intereses y a las que recurrente los administradores de intereses ajenos cuando no quieren usar de éstos con favor sólo de la desconfianza firman que con la de ellos ha de suscribir un convenio. Consideramos esto como punto principal para cualquier negociación; y la de que tratamos no puede ser más importante. Sin embargo, en el contrato «Costa Rica de la Guardia» nada hay que garantice la responsabilidad de don Wenceslao, ni dice nada tampoco al respecto el Presidente de Costa Rica y defensor de los intereses de la Guardia.

La forma más ó menos elegante en que sea presentada ó defendida una negociación, en nada altera las conveniencias ó inconvenientes prácticas de sus resultados ni es comercialmente cuento adoptar como buen principio de un negocio malo una bonita y larga teoría. Una persona ilustrada como don Ricardo, y además inteligente, ha podido llenar un folleto en defensa de un mal negocio, del mismo modo que en su contra podría llenar una biblioteca. Menos mal lo del folleto, porque... cuán o lo habría costado al país la biblioteca?

Así y todo, leyendo la defensa del proyecto sólo nos aseguramos de que en el mundo comercial son muy mal conocidas las compañías que se dedican a especulaciones como la que don Ricardo quiere para el señor de la Guardia; y nosotros sabíamos, además, que esas compañías se entienden directamente y solamente con los particulares, y que cuando más obtienen el favor nacional de una ley que las garantiza; pero nunca en la forma desproporcionada que nuestro gobierno quiere con empeño.

Tal y como el asunto está planteado, no es garantizar una compañía lo que se procura, sino constituir un capital y dársele sin responsabilidades, sin reservas y con cualquier pretexto. La forma de emisión de bonos traspasa los límites de la garantía, y vamos a demostrarlo.

Supongamos, tengamos por cierto que las responsabilidades moral y comercial de la compañía son satisfactorias y que después de un año ésta haya hecho transacciones que las obliguen a emplear £ 200,000. La utilidad infinita de la compañía, dadas las ventajas que se le quieran conceder, serían de 25 por ciento, ó fueran £ 50,000 á su haber; por las £ 200,000 de su debe a obligaciones contraídas. El Gobierno emite en bonos, según el artículo II del proyecto de convenio, la misma suma de £ 200,000, y como aquellos están garantizados por el Gobierno y por las propiedades de los interesados, muy bien pueden colocarse al 50 por ciento (ó más) igual a £ 100,000. Haciendo caso omiso del 2 por ciento de amortización y de las hipotecas, suponiendo que ese porcentaje sea aplicado doblemente y que ni él ni las hipotecas sean utilizadas para adquirir como se puede más dinero por su medio, en los cuatro años del convenio sin contar el primero, la compañía habrá cobrado el 21 por ciento, ó sean £ 48,000 al 6 por ciento anual. En resumen: Total del haber: £ 258,000. Total del deuda (obligaciones contraídas): £ 200,000. Diferencia: £ 58,000 igual a £ 50,000. Los tenedores de bonos cobrarían intereses de 5 por ciento sobre £ 160,000 ó fueran £ 32,000 pero siempre quedaría a favor del contratista, en los cinco años, una utilidad de £ 26,000, ó fueran £ 273,000 que hacen un promedio de £ 53,250 por año, ó £ 5,687,50 mensuales, utilidad que iría aumentando según fueran ensanchándose las operaciones y sin que a esa fecha tuviera la compañía capital alguno invertido ni responsabilidad efectiva de ninguna clase.

Y las expropiaciones? Y la ejecución de derechos de Aduana? Este sólo beneficio, que puede calcularse en £ 50,000 de utilidad anual para la compañía, representa un daño de igual cuantía para el país y un fondo perjuicio que por serlo para la industria y el comercio nacionales lo es igual-

mente para aquél. Y todas las otras ventajas concedidas? Y todas las desventajas aceptadas, entre las que no es la peor el descredito y la vergüenza que al país daría la torpeza de adquirir obligaciones como las que el gobierno se afama por contratar?

De otro modo, y ya que nadie garantiza la responsabilidad de la compañía; qué harían el gobierno y los hipotecados si por circunstancias imprevistas y como podría muy bien suceder, quebrara la compañía a los cinco años, por ejemplo, de comenzadas sus labores? Es natural suponer que los haberes de una compañía que quiebra han pasado á manos acreedores que harán efectivo sus derechos adquiridos legalmente. Los haberes de la compañía constructora no serían otros que las hipotecas y los bonos, porque no sería don Wenceslao de la Guardia quien concretaría sencillamente de disponer un capital para el cumplimiento de obligaciones que no lo requieren puesto que el Gobierno iría facilitando el medio circulante y ya que el solo hecho de obtener las concesiones exageradamente ventajosas del contrato le habrían campo a cualquiera para obtener hacerse un crédito sin límites. El país en general y particularmente los hipotecados, serían quienes sufrieran el fracaso de la compañía.

Y no sería eso, por cierto, una novedad en Costa Rica, como dice don Ricardo que lo es sólo para Costa Rica el contrato de construcciones; acostumbrados estamos al resultado desastroso de todos los contratos, echos por nuestros gobernantes, con empresas ó particulares; y a menudo vemos a nuestros hombres de Estado buscando con apuro arreglos onerosos para evitar mayores males de otra índole.

El contrato sería una novedad de cualquier parte. Para no serlo tendría que adoptar la forma adecuada con que se conoce en Inglaterra, en Irlanda y en Jamaica y que es como lo han pactado otros gobiernos que el mismo don Ricardo.

Si es beneficiar al país lo que el gobierno se propone, piénsese en algo menos absurdo aunque no sea una obligación de circunstancias políticas ó de personajes simpatías inexplicables. Pero prescindiendo de ese contrato que no se puede aceptar sin detrimento gravísimo para la nación.

Otras anotaciones más que dan fechas en los márgenes del único ejemplar, quizá, que ha venido á esta región olvidada de los que mandan y recordada por todos solo para explotarla; y sin la pretensión de enfrentarnos á la notoriedad reconocida de don Ricardo—permítase que el hecho de esa notoriedad y sin que el reconocimiento de su ilustración y de su jerarquía nos hagan superior poseedor de todos los conocimientos—las publicaremos también si alcanzan oportunidad en el tarde aparecer de esta hoja cuyas

dimensiones no son medida de la gran suerte con que en este y en todos los asuntos de interés público tratamos de abogar por lo justo de batallar contra lo que afecta perjudicialmente el interés de todos.







### THE COMPROMISE.

There are wars and rumours of wars, and Compromises are all expected and included in these wars. The price of this compromise in the suit of the Atlantic Fruit Coy. vs. Lindo is one hundred thousand dollars; whatever may be said or done, the fact remains that the Atlantic Fruit Coy. were right in the attitude they took in the matter. There have been diversities of opinions with regards to this transaction, lots of men have suffered because they expressed themselves on this subject, but now that the true light has been thrown on the question we hope that those who have been wronged will receive justice at the hands of those doing the wrong. It also goes to prove that the rumours which have gone abroad that the Atlantic was so hard put for cash that they would not be able to take up their obligations when the time arrived have fallen to the ground for it is plain that if it was not considered that the Atlantic could have raised the necessary amount to pay for the farms at the expiration of time, there would be no necessity for a compromise, or "Ransom Price." On the other hand, "every one knows, and conducts his business as he thinks best," but we feel the Atlantic has been a little bit ill-advised, because if they meant to fight at all, do they not see that had they persisted and taken over the Lindo's farms, the U. F. Coy. would have no fruit practically to ship. Anyhow it is an illwind that brings no one good, for if they give up that part to develop the Parismina Division as it is thought, then the sooner the better it will be for the country that they go there. We'll therefore watch the future.

### Obituary.

Very sad to relate the death of Mr. Gerald McCutchen, which as is well known is due to the bullet wound he received on Sunday night at Siquirres from the hands of a brother chip Receiver, Salvador Lacayo in defence of another Receiver, at whom Lacayo first fired his gun. He died at the Coy's Hospital at about 1:30 p.m. yesterday. Mr. McCutchen is from among the best families of Jamaica and in his youthful days was Confidential Clerk to Mr. McDowell of the Atlas Wharf. To those who knew him it is astonishing to see him here. He has always had the best confidence of the U. F. Coy. in his capacity, was well beloved among his comrades as well as the community in which he lived, who feel that we have lost a true hearted friend.

## Banana Battle.

### The motion

### In America.

From the Jamaica "Gleaner" we take the following:

New York, July 13.—The Atlantic Fruit Coy. won another signal victory over the United Fruit Coy., otherwise known as the Banana Trust, in the Federal District Court on Wednesday, when Judge Lacombe refused to grant the injunction asked for by the United Fruit Coy. against the Atlantic Fruit and Steamship Coy., Atlantic Fruit Distributors, Joseph Di Giorgio, and Salvatore Di Giorgio, officers of those Companies, to restrain the defendants from importing or selling bananas from Santa Marta in the Republic of Colombia, which place for many years has been under a practical control of the United Fruit Co. as regards fruit shipments.

Although the motion was for a preliminary injunction, the matter was argued at considerable length before Judge Lacombe and briefs submitted. Joseph Di Giorgio, President of the Atlantic "Fruit and Steamship Coy.", when interviewed regarding the matter, said:

"This action was a practical confirmation of the action of the courts of the Republic of Colombia, where before beginning the action here the United Fruit Coy. attempted to prevent the exportation by us of fruit from Santa Marta. The Colombian courts, however held that the United Fruit Coy. was not entitled to the relief it asked for. Until a year ago the United Fruit Coy. controlled the Santa Marta Railway, over which all bananas for export were carried,

When the Colombian Government ended that control, the planters who had been seeking relief and competition invited the Atlantic into the field. Negotiations were begun for the purchase of properties and about two months ago the Atlantic began shipping fruit each week from Santa Marta upon the vessels of the Hamburg American Line, with which it has contracts for the carriage of its fruit, and since that time weekly shipments have been arriving at New York, a programme which will now be continued without interruption.

The United Fruit Coy. has strenuously objected to any interference with its monopoly of the business in Santa Marta but eager have the planters been for competition that the

they cannot enter them since they have been embargoed. In some cases the U. F. Coy. has been cutting these bananas and not accounted to the people yet for the fruit, in other cases no one is cutting the fruit for the people are afraid as to what may happen. In the meantime Mr. Chittenden has been promising everyone an even deal in everything, but the people are yet doubtful in view of past traditions of the Coy. but from what we know of Mr. Chittenden, the people may rely on his promises, as he is not one of the men capable of eating his words, of course this is up to the Coy. to run down his actions, but at this juncture we do not think they could afford very well to do it.

Shipments to New York received by my company have recently equalled, and in one instance exceeded that of the U. F. Coy. We alleged in answer to the United's petition that the U. F. Coy. is a trust existing in violation of the Sherman Act, and therefore, not entitled to ask any aid from a court of equity.

Prior to Judge Lacombe's decision, the U. F. Coy., by advertisements in the press referred to the organization of the Magdalena Company which had been formed by the officers of the Atlantic Fruit and Steamship Coy. to take title to the Santa Marta plantation and in the advertisement stated that it controlled by contract the fruit grown on those properties, and warning intending investors against interference with its alleged rights. This is the same subject which is covered by Judge Lacombe's decision.

It is a well settled practice, said Judge Lacombe in this court to refuse preliminary injunctions when its issuance will injure defendant and there is serious controversy as to the facts upon which complainant bases his claim for relief. The foundation of the cause for action set forth in the complaint consists of certain contracts in the United States of Colombia with citizens and residents of that country who own real estate there with the fruit grown on which real estate contracts are concerned. The construction and interpretation of these contracts, the determination as to what rights and obligations they create are all matters to be settled in conformity with the law of Colombia. What may be the law of a foreign country is a question of fact to be shown by the testimony of other persons familiar with it."


