## La nueva Municipalidad

Sabemos que los señores que han entrado a formar parte en la Corporación Municipal están animados de las mejores intenciones y tratan de elaborar firmemente para hacer efectivo el Progreso en este Puerto; sin embargo, la dilación en hacer y enviar las notas de los nuevos nombramientos de empleados hechos recientemente, no ha dejado de causar desagrado entre los nombrados y aun entre los mismos Municipales. Dobles que ha servido cerca de 12 años en la carrera Judicial y que ha practicado como abogado y notario por largo tiempo, cuando otros por esto o por aquello, rehusaron el difícil puesto interino, luchando con las dificultades propias de toda oficina nueva y con subalternos novicios, —instaló y organizó aquella, mostrando actividad, corrección, orden y disciplina; y por ende, como era lo lógico y natural, se esperó que sustituiría en propiedad a Trejos.

Peró no fue así.—Se le asestó el golpe que no dejó de causar el daño a oscuras y por detras, posponiéndole a una persona que, aunque muy competente y honorable, no tiene siquiera el título de procurador judicial, ni la larga hoja de servicios de Dobles. (Alcalde en San José, Juez en Guanacaste y actual Alcalde en Heredia con seis años de fungir) contrariándose así el final del artículo 12 de la Ley Orgánica de Tribunales, el cual es un mito.

Por ser muy de bulto y saltar a la vista con facilidad, no discutiremos la injusticia ó irregularidad que se cometieron en el caso, posponiendo a un letrado para que un letrado oficie; pero, si afirmamos que en ellas medió la intriga ó influencia del célebre don Consistorio, apoderado de la poderosa Compania United Fruit, intrigas ó influencias ejercidas, no directa y personalmente por el enorme Señorón que es bien conocido en las alturas de los Poderes y no se le atiene, sino por los abogados en la Capital del ominoso Trust, quienes, sugestivos por los informes abultados y calumniosos de aquel sujeto deforme de cuerpo y alma, y el cual no puedo, — como lo acostumbraba — doménar con sus escigencias estólicas ó ilegales a Dobles — se dieron a librar la campaña en que triunfaron, saliéndose con las suyas y haciendo una victima mas el colosal Pulpo de la zona atlántica. Así se consumó, al menos; una inconsecuencia palpable en perjuicio del viejo Juez que, abnegado y humilde, fue a sacar del apuro é impaciencia que mostraba la Corte por proveer aquella judicatura que era un desorden y un desastre deplorables.

Y, aunque, el Juez interino Dobles

nunca mostró interés por continuar en propiedad de aquel puesto, pues siempre se le mantuvo, —para asestarlo el golpe cortero, —bajo la impresión de que Trejos, terminado el período de su licencia, volvería, —lo cierto y lo claro es que la causa eficiente de su caída, fueron la intriga y el chisme — plantas despreciables y venenosas que pagan muy bien en ciertas regiones empleadas para el fin propuesto, por the Unsted Fruit Co. a quien habia que complacer a toda costa, y a quien Dobles, Juez, y no Politico ni Diplomático, nada mas que Juez recto, no supo coimar los apetitos caprichosos y atentarios del apoderado del terrible y soberano Trust

De este modo, pues, se han puesto de relieve el prestigio y la perspectiva de la carrera Judicial en Costa Rica y se ha hecho reducir una vez mas el viejo adagio de que "poderoso caballero es don Dinero," y váyanse la entereza la actividad y la honradez que recomendaran, al rincón del desprecio y del olvido, y que prevalezca la intriga, la calumnia y el chisme; a estos, paso franco como venzan presidios del oro deslumbrador

Y, si esto no es una inmundicia, una quemante inmundicia que se vivanta é indigna, que venga Dios y lo diga!

## Naval Supremacy Victory For Wells

Paris, July 24.—That the world is not yet on the eve of the cessation of the struggle between Great Britain and Germany for naval supremacy is the prevalent opinion in France after careful study of the recent speech by Mr. Winston Spencer Churchill in the House of Commons.

The continuation of the rivalry between those two countries causes a note of regret here, but there is an inclination to believe that if it must go on, France should learn a lesson from England's procedure and herself increase her navy.

The "Matin" commenting on the subject, says it is in a position to declare that Italy and Austria at the instigation of Germany are about to build additional super-Dreadnoughts in regard to which nothing has been permitted to transpire. Italy is to construct six of these vessels, each of 20,000 tons displacement and capable of steaming at a speed of 26 knots while Austria is to build three each of them displacing 26,900 tons.

The newspaper continues: "The fulfilment of this programme will destroy the present naval equilibrium in the Mediterranean and give a big advantage to the triple alliance."

London, July 24.—The speech of Mr. Winston Spencer Churchill yesterday on the supplementary naval appropriation has provoked wide spread discussion both at home and abroad. It is held in some quarters to presage the institution of a naval law on similar lines to the German measure to provide for a systematic growth of the navy over a series of years.

It was so interpreted by Lord Selborne, who was the first Lord of Admiralty from 1900 to 1905 in a brief debate in the House of Lords this evening. He declared that Mr. Churchill's words ought to be written in letters of gold in both houses of Parliament.

In the same debate, Viscount Haldane, who recently visited Berlin for the purpose of discussing Anglo-German Relations, made an interesting statement to the effect that Germany had been told in the friendliest manner that what ever naval efforts she might make Great Britain would make still greater.

"We have said," Viscount Haldane added, "that we do this with no intention of aggression, but because sea power is our life and in sea power we intend to remain superior."

## Sovereigns to Insure lives.

Rome, July 12.—King Victor Emmanuel and Queen Helena have expressed a desire to be the first policyholders in the State insurance concern which has arisen as a consequence of the insurance monopoly act recently passed by the Parliament.

The premiums secured for the insurance on members of royal families is destined to be used as the foundation for the society.

Navy, voted almost unanimously during this year's session of the Reichstag, that it is not officially announced that the new third squadron of eight battleships will be commissioned by the autumn of 1914, far earlier than had been thought possible.

This will bring the active battle fleet up to 15 ships in full commission. Crews for the four battleships of the reserve squadron which according to the same law are to be kept in full readiness for sea at all times, will not be available probably for two or three years after, so it is pointed out here that the alarmists in the British press and Parliament are premature in assuming the presence of 29 fully manned German battleships in the autumn of 1913. This increase in the German fleet according to the statement of a responsible German diplomat, is solely due to the provocative Mansion House speech of Mr. David Lloyd George, delivered at the height of the Morocco crisis in 1911.

Commenting on the more conciliatory utterances of Mr. Lloyd George at the Mansion House this year, and on Sir Edward Grey's reference to the improvement in Anglo-German relations, the officials stated that had it not been for Mr. Lloyd George's declarations, there would have been no new German Navy Bill this year.

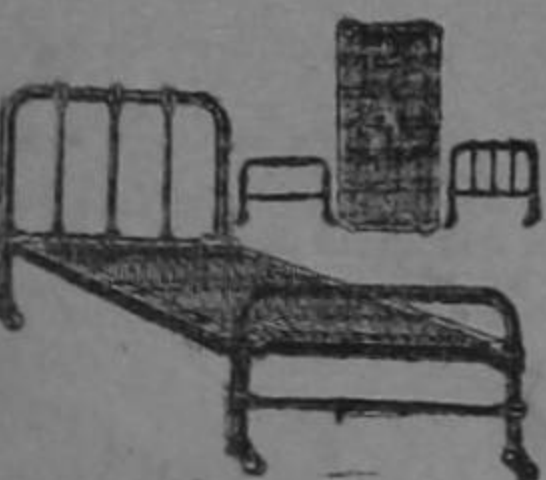

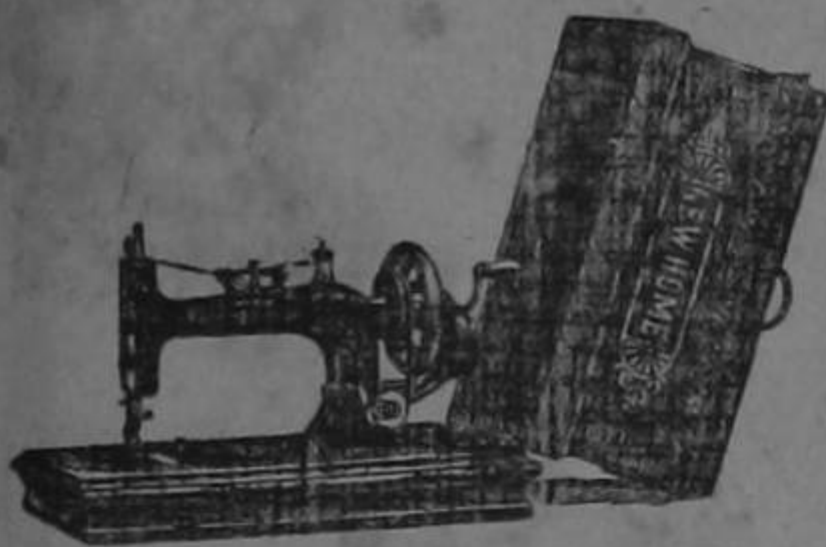

### EMANCIPATION DAY.

To-day marks the seventy-fourth anniversary with the total abolition of slavery in all the British West Indies. We are again reminded of an event great and memorable; thus this day should always be looked upon with much interest mingled with rejoicing and gratitude. Slavery is unknown to-day its awful consequences are not understood and this fact has undoubtedly created that indifference with many concerning this day.

We may like to forget the fact of the necessity of an emancipation day, equally so as the Israelites to-day forget that there was the necessity of such a day from their bondage with what they termed an inferior race or on similar lines that the Anglo-Saxons have forgotten that there was the necessity of such a day when they were sold in the markets of Rome, but the time has not yet arrived when we can boast of our perfection in all things that tend to make a people great; while yet and when the negro race has as a whole attained that standard of civilization on a par to other races then may they also pride in forgetfulness of the past, therefore let us strive forward, not unmindful however of the progress that has been made by the negro, for considering the brief period since he has been rid of the yoke of slavery, he has shown himself satisfactorily in the march of time.

He has shown marked capabilities that he is able to maintain a foremost place as a citizen anywhere and at any sphere. We have seen him individually taking his place equally with the white man in Literature, in Science, in Law, in Medicines, in War are, in Inventions and all the Arts that go to help civilization. Year by year we see the young negro sitting at examinations and coming out, if not superior yet, not inferior to the white race with all his centuries of advantages. These are proofs that the negro has made good uses of the scant advantages extended to him during the 74 years of his emancipation, but he cannot yet forget it, but rather fresh with its memory, let each one seek to foster and encourage true manhood, self-respect and self-reliance, there, by establishing the "Esprit de Corps" among the race, to educate and assist those inferior in opportunities, and so suppress that ignorance and tendency to vice, which to-day helps to keep down many. When that standard of collective intelligence, is attained, may he be proud of his conquest and he too like other races may satisfactorily be able to forget Emancipation Day and like them worship at the shrine of an Independence Day.

By chance I passed through Baltimore Farm last week on the "Local" and must say it was like the oasis to the desert. From the information that I received it seems that Mr. Chittenden imported about two years ago for Mr. Minor C Keith, about seven varieties of immunes, which were planted out in nursery shape. Mr. A. D. Brown, Mandador of Newport was entrusted by Mr. Chittenden to select the best varieties, but after careful selection he could only spot one that he thought would be good enough and that was what is known as the "Congo," i.e. 'Musa Congii.' Mr. Brown had a hard and touchy task as I understand that he condemned four other species, including plantains also the canary banana "Musa Cavandishii"

## Echos From. The Ashes.

We have heard all manner of threats along the streets because we have produced in these columns certain mean actions of the members of one of our Lodges making matters far worse than they were formerly. We are pleased that the chastisement has had such an effect on the parties concerned. We hope therefore that they will not so exhibit their ignorance and then offer to prosecute, shoot, tar, and exile respectable people for their expressions of abhorrence.

We are proud however to see that they are not lost from hope, as evidently they remain in their folly knowing that they are fools.

## New Light

Mr. Fonseca of the Lamicq Flour mill has asked us to explain the information supplied us that somewhere about 100 sacks of flour are missing from the factory accounts was incorrect. He admitted that a few sacks have been lost but not as many as were stated. He also stated that no employee was dismissed in consequence of this loss. He did not however enlighten us as to why they were dismissed.

## Awful Murder.

The Jamaica "Gleaner" gives account of a most horrid tragedy as a result of the apparent unfaithfulness of the victim, Mrs. Leidera Hyman.

It appears as if the alleged murderer, William Gay, a Demeraran, arrived in Jamaica some time ago and took lodgings at the house of this Mrs. Hyman, during this stay an intimacy seemed to have grown very strongly between them, highly detrimental to the poor husband who at the time of the tragedy, being apparently deserted for Gay, was in the Hospital, having gone there probably from want of home attention in his illness.

It turns out that after Gay's £250 pounds had vanished, Mrs Hyman sends him to manage a property she had there, while there, of course judging from the intimacy between them, he seem to have appropriated certain of the proceeds of this property and when asked about it he frankly acknowledged same, whereupon Mrs. Hyman got infuriated and placed him in charge of a policeman for non-accounting. This got Gay so mad that he determined to kill her. He went away and purchased a revolver and 50 cartridges, and he went to Mrs. Hyman and told her that he had come to settle with her, but that the amount being six pounds and as he only had three pounds ten shillings, she would have to receive that amount for the present, where upon she agreed, he quickly put his hands in his pocket and draw the revolver and shot her in the abdomen, she ran to her room and he followed her and shot her dead, then put the revolver behind his right ear and shot himself. He was taken to the Hospital, where the doctors have been unable to locate the bullet and he lies in a precarious condition, but the doctors seem to think that from his powerful constitution he may be able to rally from the effects of the gunshot. If he does, it will only be to take his trial of wilful murder, as from the surrounding circumstances, there could be no other charge.

The deceased woman leaves a 14 year old daughter who witnessed the entire transaction and who will have to carry with her through life the memory of this tragedy which cannot but mar her path through life.

Would that mothers could but reflect on the consequences their good or evil lives must have on their daughters prospects particularly.

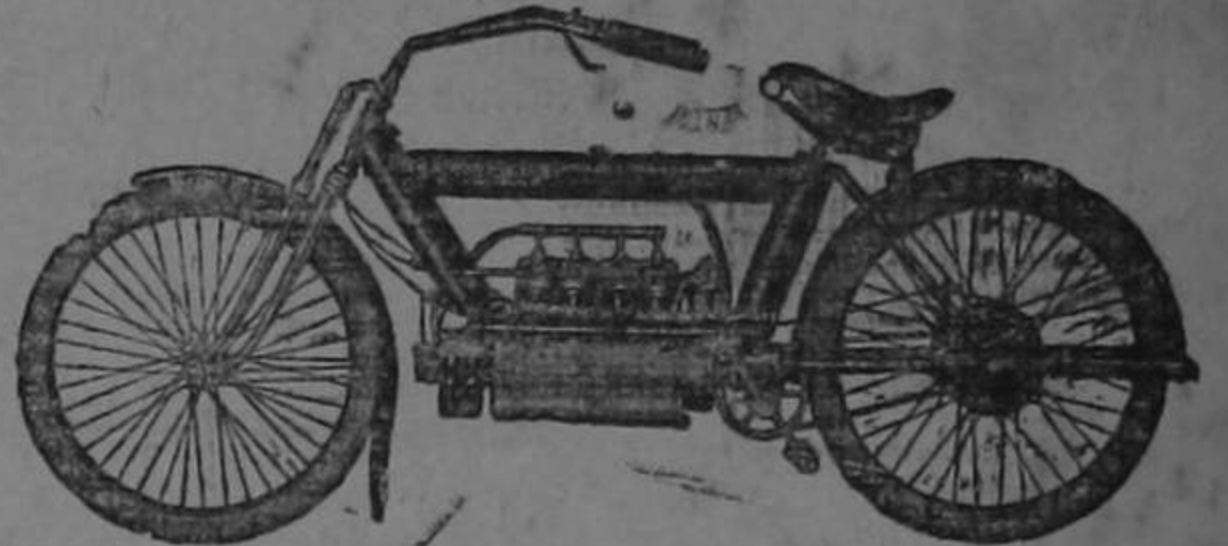
