Canada and The Empire.

London, July 24.—Alluding to the visit of Mr. Borden to France, the "Daily Mail" says this morning: "Anything tending to improve the relations between Canada and France is a gain to the Empire. The visit will also emphasize the fact that Great Britain and France have long ceased to be divided. The French-Canadians must see that in strengthening the defences of the Empire, they are also pledging the security of France."

The "Manchester Guardian" in an editorial today disparages what it describes as "the violent note of alarm sounded in Mr. Churchill's Naval speech" and urges a constructive policy of friendship with Germany without the sacrifice of the friendship of France.

The editorial continues:—

"The hopes that the colonies will extricate us from our difficulties seem widely out of proportion to the actual facts. The colonies for a long time to come will do well if they can make themselves responsible for their own Naval defence. Even Canada, which under Mr. Borden has gone further than the others, does not expect actually to lighten our burden. Moreover, her aid is conditional on serious changes in the Empire's constitution which are full of difficulties, and we think of grave inconvenience. The matter cannot be settled by sentimental impulse. Parliamentary federation is quite out of the question for the moment and colonial representation could only come by the admission of the colonies to the Executive. The result would mean an increased independence of the Executive which would aggravate the existing evil of the loss of control of foreign affairs by Parliament."

London, July 25.—The "Daily Mail's" Parliamentary correspondent declares that it is an open secret that Mr. Borden and his colleagues are prepared to recommend the contribution of £6,000,000 to build three Dreadnoughts, but nothing can be announced until the Ministers return to Canada. The "Daily Mail" believes that this knowledge influenced the British Government in preparing the recent Naval Estimates.

Diocese of Honduras.

The "Jamaica Churchman" says: "No appointment has yet been made to succeed Bishop Bury in this Diocese, although the Archishop has made strenuous efforts to secure a successor. In the meantime Archdeacon Murray at Belize is administering the affairs of the Diocese, especially in British Honduras, and Day."

Marvelous Operation.

The following surprising surgical operation is translated from the "Noticiero," Hartford Connecticut, 31st July. In the Hospital in San Francisco, an operation was performed on Mrs. Liptin, who was enceinte and suffering from a very weak heart. In effecting this Cesarean operation, in consequence of the weakness of the heart of the patient, a connection had to be made between a vein of the right arm of the husband who was a very strong man, and that of the left arm of the wife. During the half hour that this operation lasted, the husband's heart did the circulation for both bodies. The disconnections of both veins were made as soon as the heart of the woman assumed its normal condition, leaving both parties in a perfect state of health.

The operation gave beautiful results, because the male child which was taken from its mother is in fine health, weighing 12 pounds and its parents are perfectly happy.

World's Politics

In the differences between England and Germany, commenting on the views expressed by Mr. Balfour, Lord Haldane, Sir Thomas Barclay and others the newspapers in commenting on the situation agree of the need of the existence of a strong German fleet as a vital issue for Germany to protect its constantly growing foreign commerce and insure the import of food as necessary for Germany as for England.

It is pointed out that even in the best times Germany only raises enough food to feed her inhabitants six days of the week, and cites English statistics to show that while England has to import food for thirty millions of her inhabitants, Germany must do the same, for from twenty one to thirty two millions of hers.

In view of these sentiments it is calculated that any attempt now to ameliorate circumstances may tend to intensify the controversy.

CRONICA EXTRANJERA

Influencia del sol en la telegrafía inalámbrica.

Durante el eclipse de sol del 17 de Abril se hizo en París una notable experiencia relativa á la telegrafía sin hilos.

Se ha notado desde hace mucho tiempo que la distancia que pueden recorrer los radiotelegramas varía según la hora y la dirección en que se envían. Un despacho lanzado por vibraciones rápidas y que no llega á más de 700 millas durante el día, pude recorrer una distancia de 1,400 y hasta 2,000 millas después de la puesta del sol, sobre todo en la dirección Sur. Si se trata de vibraciones lentas, el despacho pudo llegar durante el día á una distancia mayor que la indicada.

Estos curiosos fenómenos se atribuyen á la influencia de los rayos ultra-violetas del sol, dando los grandes cambios que experimentan las condiciones atmosféricas entre la salida y la puesta del sol.

El eclipse ha proporcionado una magnífica oportunidad para la prueba decisiva. Habiéndose enviado mensajes desde la Torre Eiffel, sin interrupción, y en dos direcciones, desde el momento que precedió al eclipse hasta poco después los hechos han confirmado la teoría de que los rayos ultra-violetas del sol son un factor poderoso de energía para las ondas hertzianas.



His time in England was occupied for the most part in matters of deepest importance to Jamaica such as the question of the best means of postal conveyances, road motors, etc. Dredging for swamp reclamation, taking advices from learned Counsels on Tramway Coy's disputes, the service between Jamaica and Canada, Agent for Jamaicans in Central America and such like matters—with regard to which he told a "Gleaner" representative that he had discussed with the Foreign Office, the question of an Agent for Jamaicans in Central America:

The Foreign Office with whom the matter rests, was prepared to understand, to co-operate in the establishment of such an agency, and to ask the Imperial Government to increase their contribution towards the office expenses of administration in Central America, but it had not yet been absolutely decided as to what the salary attached to the position should be whether it should be filled by an officer in the Consular Service, or by an officer in the Colonial Service of Jamaica. His impression was that it might be better to appoint a gentleman who was connected with the Colonial Service of this Island. It is expected that Sir Claude Mallett, Minister Plenipotentiary to the Republic of Panama, will shortly be paying a visit to Jamaica; and His Excellency said he would then have an opportunity of discussing the matter with him and receiving his final recommendations on the subject. Relative to his stay being prolonged after May next, when his term of office will expire. His Excellency said that he was not in a position to say anything on that question as he did not know whether he would be sent to another Colony or what.

Petty thefts

Of late foul stealing is rampant in town. Several people who have rented quarters near Dr. Echeverria's building are constantly complaining of serious loss of fowls weekly. It is reported that certain tenants occupying rooms on the western wing of the building in question are stealing and carrying off fowls, chickens, and all by the fives and tens every night. It is hoped that the police will keep a good look for these carnivorous animals.

A couple nights ago there was also a robbery of cacao at Mrs. Arnold's farm. From what we are told, the cacao house was entered into during the night and about 120 lbs. cacao stolen from it. As soon as the door was opened in the morning, Mr. Nunes, the Overseer discovered that cacao was missing, although the Foreman



THE PRESENT CRISIS

We cannot but note the present depression in trade in and around Limón. Of course this is practically noticeable in consequence of the activity that surrounded us while the engagements were proceeding between the two Coy's. We have seen men around us who might never have had a chance of a job with the U. F. Coy. suddenly springing into prominence with that Coy., as Supervisors of fruit or Tracers of boundary line Eaves droppers and Secret Service Detectives all under pay. Why, even the foremen from the different farms around the country who were chosen to assist in the work of protection to the rights of the U. F. Coy. they all had to be in Limón or around during the time the struggle lasted which meant extra life to the trade of the town. Then again there were the employees of the Atlantic Fruit Coy. who had no jobs for months and months gone by, suddenly putting in their dollars in the stream of commerce. On the other hand, farmers all felt happy and contented with their extra fruits (gold) and the prospect of the sale of the six hands fruit along with a security that none of their fruit would be rejected, put on to this the lavish way in which these watchmen were entertained, for even the openly men have all been nicely compensated through the foresight of their genial chief Mr. Chitterden, by accommodating them with provisional or transferable time cheques in consequence of their absence from home and faithful service. All these things have tended to brighten up trade while the contest lasted, but now that it is all gone, and the hopes of competition lost, even although the United Company has been generous enough to grant amnesty to the vanquished soldiers of their foe, yet the sudden fluctuation could not but have its corresponding disastrous effect on trade. We see several places being closed, we hear the rent collectors all complaining, and even although don Carlos has dropped the price of beef to 15cts per lb, the people cannot show their appreciation of his generosity by responding in the quantity bought. One cannot but reflect that all this is caused by the failure in securing competition. Let us hope however, that as we hear of an option that that option may be taken advantage of and one day we may see the Atlantic Fruit Company cultivating on a powerful scale in the Parismiana Valley. We already see the Lindo Fruit Coy planting and falling large tracts of land in the Bananito Division, so that in a few months deliverance may be sent to our doors or we shall all likewise perish.

International

Bible Class

Limon, Aug. 4—Notwithstanding the rain, the Bible Students Hall was crowded to hear Mr. V. E. Samuels, who lectured from the topic: "Is there life beyond the grave?" In part he said Job's question is similar to ours when he said "if a man die, shall he live again Job 14, v. 14."

He agreed with both Catholics and Protestants, that only the saintly few will go to heaven, but ask what will become of the 1,200,000,000 heathen dying at the rate of 90,000 a day (according to a Missionary Journal) in Christless despair! He said however that he disagrees that at the moment of death one passes into Heaven of bliss if faithful as a saint or if not, into eternal torment, which our forefathers with all good intention believed and taught; but would rather agree with the Bible which teaches very plainly that the dead know nothing Ps. 146, v. 4, Job 3, vs. 17-19, Ecc. 9, v. 5 that through Adam's disobedience the sentence of death (not eternal torment) passed upon him and his race. Gen. 2, v. 17, Roms. 5, 12, 1 Cor. 15 v. 22, Ezek. 18, vs. 4, 20.




