Another Opinion.

Mr. Editor:
Sir,—Permit me space in your valuable columns to express my opinion of an illogical as well as insulting article headed "Re-corporation" in your paper of the 9th inst., with Mr. Shaw's signature. In the issue of the 7th inst., Mr. McDonald solicited the expressions of opinions on his suggestion respecting a Club or Union which could be formed in Costa Rica, having its headquarters in Limon, and would if conducted on proper lines, be able through its members and a lawyer to be retained to investigate and make right all injustices meted out to West Indians in this Republic. Mr. Shaw's article strayed away from the subject. If he intended to throw any light on Mr. McDonald's suggestion, he has only groped in the darkness given to the intelligent public the substance of his ignorance. He expressed some opprobrious epithets and imperious phrases which had nothing to do with the point at issue. I guess Mr McDonald as well as the public has failed to see the reasoning of the writer. What has Breaksmen pay of 30 colones per month, or the girls who refuse to attend Sunday School because their dresses get short, has to do with the subject? I fail to see the analogy. If the Government in the dark ages of Costa Rica did not see the advisability of enacting special laws to deal with West

A Correspondent's View

Mr. Editor:
Sir,—Please permit me space in your valuable columns to express a few sentiments on an article published on Tuesday 10th inst, headed 'Co operation, the above written by one who was thought to have better sense and superior knowledge' has placed the West Indians as a people lowered and debased in the estimation of the Costa Rican and other people of other nations, who have come across such "absurd composition." And not only that, but that gentleman has blighted himself and family by expressing those sentiments of spite and hatred which he has no doubt been summing up in his mind for years and has only expressed them now that he has an opportunity offered through the same and sensible expressions of an intelligent man.

The article with which I am now dealing, (and which has caused a widespread feeling of annoyance), is nothing at all in connection with co-operation. It has cast a great blot on your paper, and if this is not in some way remedied, I believe the TIMES will suffer greatly.

Great comments have been made thereon, and I trust that ere this, that worthy has heard enough of same, to make him ashamed of himself, knowing that naturalization does not change blood, although it has the power to abandon one's flag. In short, Naturalized Costa Rican is still a Jamaican with whatever addition or subtraction he may choose to make; and if he has his axe to grind he should have employed some other means outside of using the united force of a whole country to turn his wheel, and further more he is being supported here by the patronage of West Indians chiefly, and should have thought twice of the effects of his malicious sentiments on the welfare (or progress) of his future business career before doing anything so stupid.

I sincerely trust that some correction will be made thereto and so remove the dirty blot which is now cast (as it never was) on West Indians generally. Such things should never have been printed to be seen and read by an intelligent public. Thanking you for space.

India, there will be no necessity now that the Republic is civilized; nor will it be needed for men to go about armed. Mr. Shaw must remember that West Indians are not barbarians.

The Northern Railway does not thank this gentleman for advertising the wages of their breakmen nor does the church regard with gratitude his reason given for the lacking in attendance of the Sunday School girls and neither does his timely advice to the government of this Republic in enacting special laws, meet with any consideration.

All these assertions only tend to prove the drastic ignorance of the writer.

I think Mr. Shaw has outstepped the bounds of decency and propriety in most of his assertions. In designating West Indian as "British Object," he includes himself, despite his claim to the Costa Rican soil, and the phrase more so suit the writer as he has now placed himself on exhibition, having now displayed such unshameable ignorance that will put him on record for the next decade.

West Indians generally are law-abiding people and any disreputable characters amongst us are the exiles of the Isle of Springs, whose presence in their native land could not be tolerated. Mr. Shaw must remember that he is dependent on West Indians, (especially Jamaicans) for his living, and to hurl these unwelcome assertions will mean less business for him.

The Syndicate Big Lawsuit.

Fight and Bloodshed.

There was an awful bochincas in Bananito yesterday between the labourers working on the construction.

The Commandancia was telephoned, and a squad of police requisitioned for, to quell the riot. How many were engaged in the fight we have not yet heard, but Joaquin Kuiz, a Nicaraguan was brought down dead and Jose Cordero a Colombian very badly wounded with one eye completely chopped out and the face and left side of the head almost cut open along with about 19 individuals who are supposed to be implicated more or less in the fight. Dr. Cespedes and Commandante Bolano attended at the office of the Juez and took the necessary declarations after which the dead was buried and Cordero

was sent to the Hospital where he is in a position to die at any moment.

Bananito is a deserted place and need a police station there to preserve order among the hundreds of men who are working there on construction works. Further details of the fight will follow.

Como todos los negocios de Limón, la propiedad urbana se ha resentido del abatimiento económico; ya van pasando los dorados tiempos en que los altos salarios y la escasez de viviendas eran pingües fuentes de rendimiento, para el propietario de cualquier barracón malsano. El área de construcciones, aumentada considerablemente sin que el número de pobladores haya crecido en la misma proporción; y la competencia de viviendas baratas en los suburbios, harán por ahora imposible cualquier demanda exagerada de habitaciones en el centro.

El precio de los alquileres de casas tenderá que bajar forzosamente, y a pesar de ese descenso la propiedad urbana será siempre un negocio reproductivo, sobretudo para los que construyan sólidamente, con comodidades e higiene para los inquilinos.

Los vecinos asalariados de Limón, podrán obtener con la mayor oferta de habitaciones, la ventaja de la elección, que au-

tes no tenían, y preferirán como es natural, escoger los lugares más sanos, más confortables e higiénicos de la población.

Los propietarios de barracas ruinosas, los que no rellenan o desagüen sus patios, los que no provean de suficiente agua a sus inquilinos, los que no tengan baños y excusados en buen estado, y capaces para todos, los que no procuren la limpieza en sus lotes, esos verán sus casas insalubres e incómodas, deshabitadas o de preciadadas, porque como es natural, en toda competencia, la elección se inclina siempre al lado de lo mejor y más conveniente.

Lo que no ha podido realizar la letra muerta de nuestro incumplido Reglamento de Construcciones lo ejecutarán, la necesidad, y el progreso de la cultura popular, imponiendo al propietario la mejora sanitaria de las viviendas.

Ya lo estamos viendo prácticamente, en aquellos lotes de casas que tienen patios cemen-

tados o bien rellenos y con suelo firme y seco, donde hay buenos excusados y baños, y agua abundante, con sus correspondientes pilas, q' por lo general, son las más solicitadas y las habitan inquilinos formales en los pagos.

Las casuchas, las barracas en patios zaamosos, tienen por moradores, gentes de tránsito, que exigen en su trato mayores complicaciones en la administración y cobranza del inquilinato.

Todas las poblaciones se renuevan y mejoran por fases o edades progresivas. Limón ya pasó de la edad del rancho y del barracón de madera, enclavados en el solar palustre durante el periodo de fundación y explotación inicial de estos lugares; hoy todos sus vecinos aspiran a arraigarse en una ciudad moderna y salubre, donde ya es tiempo que desaparezcan todas esas ruinas de casas, destartaladas, con patios cenagosos.

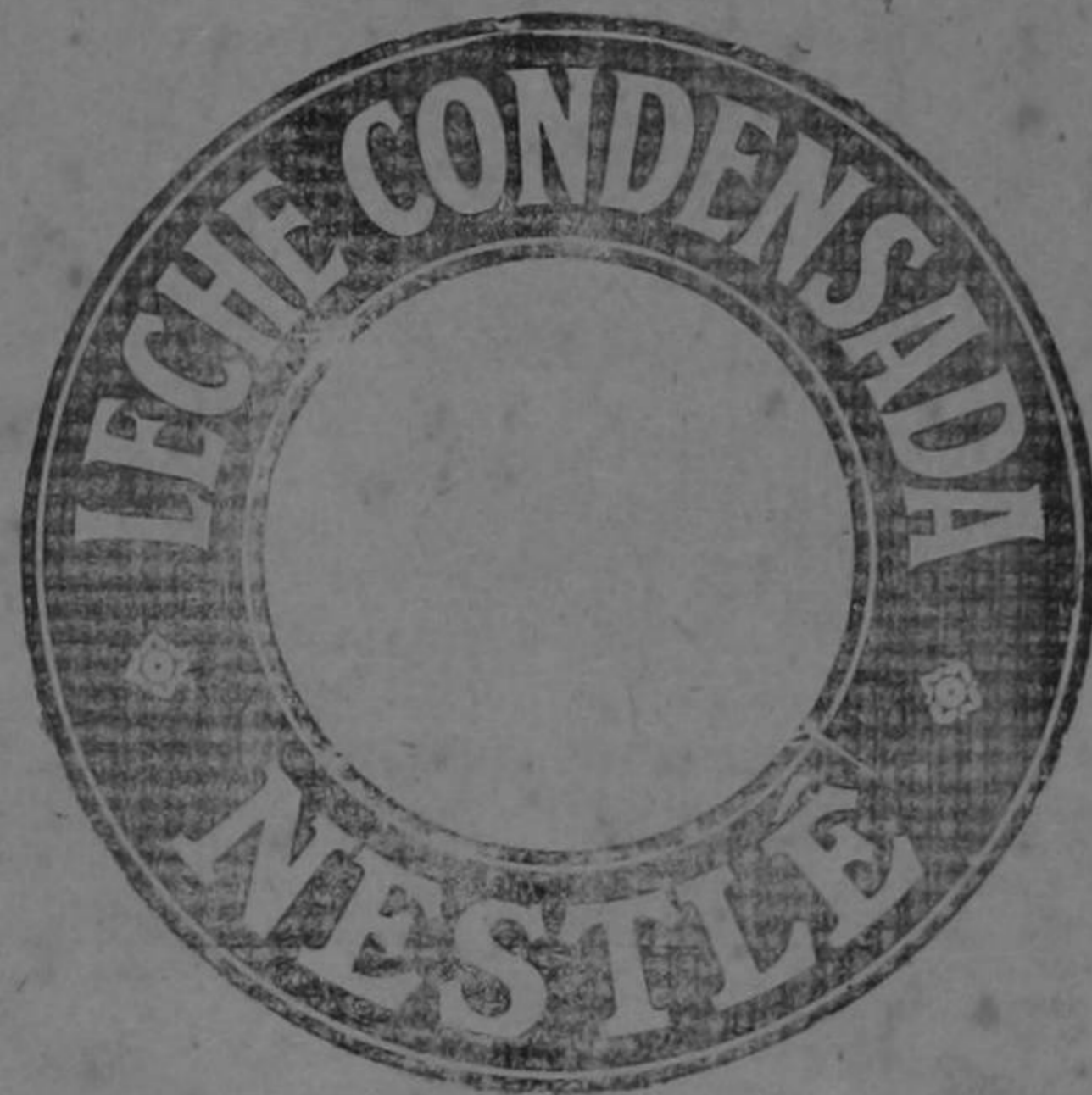
