

Dummy Cartridges for Turkish troops.

New light is thrown on the route of the Turkish troops in Macedonia by the discovery that besides being badly organized and badly led, they were in great part provided with dummy cartridges and dummy bullets. It is stated that the cartridges were supplied to Turkey by the Deutsche Waffen und Munitionsfabriken of Karlsruhe. They were intended solely for use in manoeuvres with the Turkish Mauser rifle, and were labelled "wooden manoeuvre cartridges." By what means they came to be served out to soldiers facing the Serbian shells and bullets is unknown. Wooden bullets should be harmless at any distance over a few yards.—The Clarion.

Crime in New York

There has been discovered in New York a body of men formed for the purpose of insuring people's houses who could not do it themselves; they afterwards had men employed to burn these premises. One agent of theirs confessed having got one hundred dollars for each fire set.

The strike among the Hotel waiters and men have assumed a peculiar phase; it is said that the president of the strikers, Eitor, incited the strikers to return to work and poison the food in these hotels, and so get the hotel owners scared to yield to their demands, but Giovanni, the partner of Eitor says that this report is not true but what was done was, to advise the waiters and cooks to burn or in some way render useless the food in the hotels so as to frighten the hotel keepers.

The Field Of Blood.

The South of Puntarenas near the Frontier of this Republic and Panama there is a little village by the name of Conte; this hamlet is said to be "neutral territory" so-called settled Republic independent from this and Panama where the lawless and the most desperate class of people live, perpetrating crimes of the most atrocious character; hardly a night, traces of blood are not seen. A fight occurred in that vicinity a few days ago where a man named Tandio Serrin received six stabs from a knife and fourteen revolver shots, he had to be taken to the hospital in Puntarenas where he lies in a most precarious condition.

This little hamlet is belonging to Costa Rica and some forcible steps should be taken to prevent this bloodshed there.

Mr. Mullins' Gift.

Let us hope that the big Boss will take our feeble hint, for it is evident he had forgotten the nuisance which that gully is to us.

The Municipality also seems sleeping or they would have approached Mr. Mullins with this improvement rather than stop at 3rd street which will be of no use to anyone but the Northern Railway.

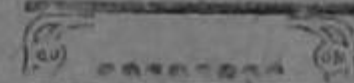

Rumours.

A rumour was circulated here yesterday that the Pay Car was held up at Siquirres, and Paymaster Baker shot dead. We however quickly ascertain that this was unfounded. What we gathered was that there was a strike and riot at Barmouth by the labourers there, and a special train was despatched with 30 armed police to quell the disorder, which seem to have given rise to the rumour.

Some Camp Cars with cots were also despatched to Bannito construction, and in five minutes the town was filled with the rumour that Mr. Whitmore had arrived and the Banana Campaign had again started; hence these Camp Cars.

Street Preaching.

We notice a troupe of women in our midst from Jamaica, again with their street preaching; it is strange that this is tolerated by the police, because they would not tolerate the Salvation Army preaching on the streets. This is the same woman who professed doing wonders here by her superstitious beliefs, some two or three years ago, and left for Jamaica with a considerable amount of money thereby, and here she is back in her fields again. Only last week's "Gleaner" tells us of a pair of these people being arrested and prosecuted for the same class of preaching and warnings, they will not be tolerated there, hence they come here to disturb the peace of respectable citizens. It is bad enough to have these fanatics yelling and gabbling in what they term "the unknown tongue" specially granted them by the spirits, but to have them on the streets with their ignorant superstitions, only tends to lower the rest of their countrymen in the opinions of foreigners. It is strange the good spirits never communicate these qualifications to anyone but the most ignorant.

The names of several members were removed from the Books for non-payment of dues.

A lucky Steward.

In its issue of the 13th ult., the "Port of Spain Gazette" published the following:

"There is a tide in the affairs of men if taken at the flood leads on to fortune; omitted, all the voyage of their lives is bound in shallows and in miseries." These famous words of the immortal poet Shakespeare were fully illustrated on the present trip of the French steamer "Guadeloupe" which arrived yesterday morning from Colon and Venezuelan ports and left during the day for Europe. When the vessel steamed out of Bordeaux harbour recently, little did Albert Perrier, a steward employed in the tween decks, anticipate that before the round trip was accomplished, he would have had sufficient money to give up the briny deep and settle down in his home in Southern France. This however, actually happened, for on the "Guadeloupe's" arrival at Colon last week he bought a lottery ticket which cost him ten shillings, and before the ship left that port he was handed a cheque for the sum of eight thousand dollars. This is by no means a very large sum, but certain it is that if he worked as a steward on the Guadeloupe for the balance of his life, Perrier could not have accumulated it. As usual when the mail ships reach Colon in time for drawing of these lotteries, nearly all the officers of the Guadeloupe including her Commander Captain Jasseau bought tickets. The steamer was still in the harbour when the announcement was made that one of the Guadeloupe's crew was the lucky winner of the lottery. Needless to say, all those of the Officers who had invested in tickets hurried shorewards to ascertain their fate. The real winner however remained quietly on board until his superiors brought him the welcome news. He passed through this port yesterday on his way to France probably for the last time as a tween deck steward on the Guadeloupe.—"Gleaner"

Indecent Visitors.

On Thursday night whilst the Band was discoursing a harmonious waltz under the direction of Señor Manuel Octo, suspicion was aroused by the Police when a respectable young man of this town and his companion were arrested for peculiar behaviour around the Governor's Office. This caused a quick gathering, but was dispersed immediately. Visitors should understand that the Park was not made for such pleasures.

By Cable.

Advices were received here that the American warships Michigan, South Carolina Vermont and 10 torpedo boats visited Colon and remained 8 days in that port. One thousand marines received permission to visit the Canal accompanied by a naval patrol. The strictest order was observed.

In New York 60,000 men struck work parading the streets with a band of music 750 police were on the scene to preserve order.

Expectant eyes have been watching every move of the Atlantic Fruit Coy. in the financial world, and the long suspense in knowing what has been going on, seem to have made the tension greater and the anxiety none the less irritating to those deeply interested in the prospects of this enterprise.

At last advices have been received to the effect that the Atlantic Fruit and Steamship Coy. has been sold out to what is now known as the Atlantic Fruit Coy. with Mr. DiGiorgi still as President and General Manager, and information to the effect that the Coy. has been placed on a far better financial footing than he was formerly, therefore we can hope that the Coy. will soon be in a position to extend her operations to Costa Rica as was formerly intimated, without which this country would be in a sad dilemma.

One thing however, that we cannot pass by and that is, that according to the new developments in the sale of the old Coy., it is evident that in as much as the means adopted might not have been considered judicious, yet the firm of Lindo Bros. seemed to have been correct in withdrawing from their business connections with the old company; because if as is stated in the "Gleaner" that for every five shares in the old company, the new company extends to the shareholders one share, it is plain that that firm seem to have foreseen a peculiar manipulation of figures, hence with other inducements, it is natural that they should protect themselves.

However, we are proud to see that the Atlantic is now established on sound financial basis for which the firm of Lindo Bros. was intended to be utilized, and from reliable information, she will soon be back in Costa Rica.

A Start.

We are pleased to be able to report an early start of the new industry for the manufacture of banana figs, etc.

The site has been acquired, and the factory will be located at Cieneguilla. The clearing, cleaning and fencing of the lands are to be started at once, hence we can within a few weeks look forward to a start of the factory buildings.

The labour for the factory will be sought for among the feminine sex, hence this will be quite an acceptable news to the women and girls of Limon. It is only a pity that there are not a few such industries around Limon, to help to teach our girls self reliance.

The facilities of our Astute Detective Inspector, will now be called to bear, because instead of chopping up the rejected bananas in the cars, he may be instructed to erect a patrol station at Cieneguilla Bridge, to prevent the robbery of these rejections to be sold to the new factory.—Vamos a ver.

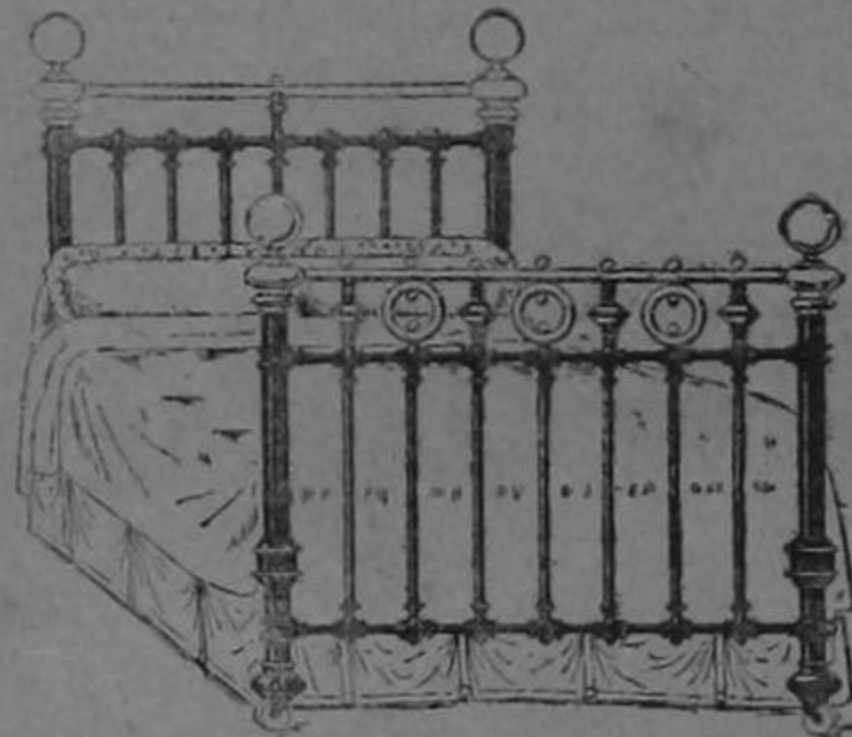
