## Incident at Brazil.

Rio Janeiro, Jan. 2.—According to an official report, the German cruiser Bremen did not attempt to recruit Brazilians of German extraction. The German consul only invited German young men of age for military service to be examined by the surgeon of the cruiser and about a dozen did so, but only one was admitted, and he is a German subject, not a Brazilian.

## Public Buildings.

The Government has signed a contract with the English Construction Coy. which Don Wenceslao de la Guardia represents, to build in Limon, buildings to accommodate the Garrison, Prison and the necessary offices and dwellings for the Commandante and his men, at a cost of £12,000 or \$126,000. Payments to be made on easy terms. While Don Alberto Gonzalez Soto has offered to loan to the Municipality of San José, the money necessary to pave 21 South street which passes through his property, at 8 per cent per annum.

**A New Comet. Fire in San Jose. Killed by Explosion**

The new comet known as "Gale's," discovered early in September, is now visible near the southwest horizon after sunset, says a recent issue of the London Sphere. As viewed with the naked eye, it resembles a faint nebulous star, but in a small telescope it is seen to possess a tail two degrees in length. As in the case of all comets, mystery surrounds its origin, though from its calculated orbit we know that it will keep at a safe distance from the earth and that we are spared the catastrophe such as is here represented. The poisonous hydro carbon tail shown will not kill all life upon the earth.

An astronomical correspondent writes: "Anything that is spun on its axis has a tendency centrifugally, to throw off its particles outward. In this way was the moon thrown off from the earth when the latter was in its earlier and molten state and bulged much more at the equator than it does now. At present the distant aspect of the earth can scarcely be distinguished from the true sphere but there is still a substantial discrepancy, and set level at the equator is thirteen miles further from the earth's centre than it is at the poles."

An immense fire broke out in San Jose, destroying the entire block in front of the Theatre, on which stands the building of the Banco Anglo. The fire originated in the tailoring establishment of "Londres y Paris" in front of Hotel Central.

All the men concerned in the business were arrested and what is strange is that Mr. Delcore the senior partner in the business, just arrive yesterday from Panama.

This is the 3rd fire in San Jose within a couple of weeks. We hope this will be a warning to the authorities to secure an efficient fire brigade service, which they so badly need

**Cricket.**

The long looked for match between the "Jamaicans" and "Other West Indians" team came off on Thursday at 1 p.m. The All Comers guessed the coin correctly and went out to face the bowling of S. Nation and D. R. Horton, which they found very difficult to handle. The fielding however of the Jamaican team was awfully poor, chance after chance was let go, and in fact the ball was simply thrown about and runs got by the apparent disinterestedness of the fieldsmen, so very disheartening to the bowlers, due however to the keen judgement of both bowlers, they were dismissed for the sum of 52 runs.

Messrs. Geo. Hart and Bobb Spencer then faced the bowling of H. Smith and West, which they fairly collared, but for want of judgement, several batsmen in their anxiety to get runs were run out and at one time the game looked pretty fishy for the Jamaicans, but Nation's partnership with Hart did the trick; he quickly running up the desired 12 and when he was caught his side had just won by one run with four wickets yet to fall which four were easily dismissed for 9 runs of which J. Benson got 7. The chief scorers being Spencer 19, Nation 12 and Hart 11; and for the "All Comers," Cox 16, and Rouse 11. Nation secured 7 wickets for 12 runs

Messrs. Armstrong and S. Ebb did good service as Umpires which caused the game to end in very pleasant aspirations

**Bogus Lodges.**

It is learnt that the members of the Loyal Phoenix Lodge of the Mechanics Order, went to 28 Miles and organized a new Lodge there with only 8 members. It is very strange that such perversion of the rules of the order should be tolerated by the Jamaica District under which these gentlemen are working; because Rule 21 of the District Laws clearly provides that "no fewer than 12 proper applicants" can get together for the formation of a Lodge, therefore the formation of this Lodge is illegal, and Grand Council must decide this question.

Toulon, France, Jan. 6.—Eight men were killed today by an explosion in the stoke hold of the French battle ship Massena. The Massena accompanied by two cruisers was proceeding for Bizerta. She was passing the Hyere Islands when the steam collect or pipe of one of the boilers burst. The warship was immediately stopped and the engine room staff rushed to the stokehold where they found a Petty Officer, six stokers and an officer lying on the floor dead. The ship put back and landed the bodies at the St. Mangerier Naval Hospital.

The cause of the accident has not yet been ascertained, but it has occasioned great surprise among the naval authorities as the steam piping on the Massena had been completely renewed two years ago and was thoroughly tested last year

**Panama Canal.**

Panama, Jan. 1.—That the canal must be ready for the passage of ships by July 1st of next year is the understanding of many canal workers. Some go so far as to state that Colonel Geethals has given orders to that effect.

To help accomplish this assurance that ships may go through next summer, a report around Canal Zone headquarters Saturday and Sunday, had it that the Central Division has received orders to complete a channel one hundred and fifty feet wide at bottom, all through Culebra Cut, and leave the widening of it to the full 300 feet till later on. This same general opinion took notice of the fact that according to present progress, McClintick Marshall Company, who are erecting the lock gates, will have all the gates of one set of locks ready before next July.—"Star and Herald."

Iglesias Castro

Un entusiasmo se notó en esta ciudad desde el miércoles recién pasado con motivo de la próxima llegada del Señor don Rafael Iglesias, procedente de los Estados Unidos, á donde lo habían llevado sus negocios particulares. Por todas partes solo se oía hablar del ilustre personaje y sus amigos, que son la mayoría de los habitantes de esta Provincia, hacían preparativos para un recibimiento digno de él.

En la creencia de que el vapor llegaría al amanecer del jueves se reunió en el muelle metálico una multitud de admiradores del Sr. Yglesias; pero no llegó sino á las doce del día; no obstante lo inconveniente de la hora porque todos los trabajadores se encontraban en sus quehaceres, la concurrencia fué numerosa; no había menos de trescientas personas ávidas por dar la bienvenida al Jefe del Partido Civil en quien confían, cifran sus esperanzas de liberación de la Patria.

Velázquez, don Aníbal Rivas, don Napoleón Chávez, don Federico Golcher, don Nicolás Flórez, don José Ángel Nieto, don José Bartoli, don Luis Vanni, don Rafael Cojón, don León Bonilla y muchos más que por el momento no recordamos fueron los primeros en darle el saludo de bienvenida. Luego una oleada de amigos siguió disputándose el honor de rendirle su homenaje. Aquello fue imponente: él se quedó sin estrecharle

la mano y para todos tuvo el señor Iglesias palabras afectuosas, señal inequívoca del hombre democrático, que lo mismo se asimila al campesino y al obrero cuando con ellos se encuentra, como al potentado cuando con él se aparta.

También varias señoras y señoritas de nuestra sociedad, varias señoras de nuestros campesinos y algunos familiares del señor Iglesias concurren para darle la enhorabuena.
