## Two hearted family Shooting Affray.

Laston, Pa., Jan. 16.—A case of two hearts in one body, said by physicians to be the first in medical science, was discovered here yesterday by Dr. James A. Morgenstern when he was called to the residence of Berzon Perkins to attend one of the children, who was suffering from smallpox.

When the physician placed his hand on the right side of the child's chest he was amazed to find a heart beating there and a moment later was astonished to find another heart on the left side.

It led him to request Mrs. Perkins to allow an examination of herself and the other children, and the physician found that not only the child but the mother and two other children in the family each had two hearts.

Panama, Jan. 21.—A shooting affray occurred in the office of the newspaper "El Tiempo" of Colon Wednesday afternoon. It is reported that Mr. Tertuliano Martinez, incensed at an offensive article against him published in the newspaper mentioned, entered the office of Mr. Rafael de la Espriella, the director of the journal, and drawing a revolver, opened fire on him at close range. Mr. Espriella replied in like manner with a pistol conveniently at hand. Neither man was wounded in the exchange of shots, although they were separated by only a few paces and onlookers interfered and prevented them continuing the fire. They were both arrested, but were later released on bail. The affair caused a sensation in Colon, both men being prominent.

## New Oil Co. In Panama.

Panama, Jan. 16.—Complying with a clause in its Government contract, providing that local capital be given first opportunity to subscribe, the Panama Petroleum Co., capitalized at \$400,000, has put its stock on the market here. The company proposes to establish in Panama a refinery to handle petroleum brought from Peru, distributing its products through Panama, Central and South America, the West Indies and other nearby markets in competition with the Union Oil Co. of California. The company was organized by Enrique de la Guardia, Ricardo Bermudez and Lindon W. Bates, Jr.

According to another despatch from Panama, the new company will compete for the Jamaica trade.

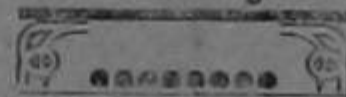

## Was German Spy,

London, Jan. 17.—George C. Parrott, formerly a gunner, was sentenced to four years' imprisonment when convicted of being a spy for the German Government.

## Another Point won

London, Jan 15.—Women won another step toward equality with men today, when the Royal Geographical Society by a vote of 130 to 51, passed a motion by Lord Curzon of Kedleston to admit them as fellows on the same terms as men.

Lord Curzon announced that a referendum by correspondence on this subject had resulted in 2,189 votes in favour of admitting women to 678 against.

London, Jan — Women were excluded from practising law at the British bar by an overwhelming vote of the Bar Association at its annual meeting.

## The Balkan war

The Turkish Cabinet has rejected the propositions for peace by the Powers. In consequence of the threatened rebellion of her troops if the Turkish government attempt to give up Adrianopolis

The note to the Powers says: "we are not desirous of the continuation of the war, but we are resolved to preserve the possession of Adrianopolis at all costs which is an indispensable condition of peace."



## Pilgrims Drowned.

Singim, Jan. 22.—Three hundred and fifty Mohammedan Pilgrims from India to Mecca was drowned today by flood which overwhelmed the entire caravan at its encampment midway between the sacred city of Medina, Arabia, and the port of Yembo on the Red Sea.

A sudden avalanche accompanied by great torrents of waterswept down the mountain in the neighbourhood of the camp, carrying away in its path people, animals and tents. Only fifty of the four hundred pilgrims composing the caravan were saved and since reached Wiembo.

## Mr. Lloyd George And the Land

The talk in official and legal circles is (according to the London correspondent of the "Liverpool Courier") that Mr. Lloyd George has a pretty little scheme in hand for dealing with the land for local purposes that may be regarded as supplementary to his famous Budget enactments. The proposals is to adopt the scale of valuation drawn up for increment taxation purposes as the basis also for local rating purposes. The possibility of such a device was not unforeseen when the valuation proposals were under discussion, and it explains to some extent the official amiability in the matter of accepting some high estimates. The iniquitous landowner is to get the worst of both worlds, to be shown in taxation as well as rating, and Mr. Lloyd George doubtless counts on the interested co-operation of local rating authorities, who will not, however, in the result be likely to gain very much by tiger-hunting with the little Welsh attorney. The latter will pretty certainly claim the lion's share for Imperial purposes, either directly or indirectly.

## The Czar's Latest Play.

The egoism of Mr. W. E. Mullins was fully displayed on Wednesday evening when the passenger train was held up by a slide. The passengers had to be transferred from one train to another on the other side of the slide, to the great surprise of the passengers on getting on the other side, they found the 1st class coach locked, and they were informed by the crew that they had to travel in the 2nd class coach. Here to their disgust, they discovered that the General Manager's Coach was also caught in the slide, and the only 1st class coach was reserved for him alone. He jumped in the Car and shut himself up, the train proceeded to Siquirres where he came over with the tourist train to Limon. Now this sort of treatment to the public by the Manager of a Railroad seems vulgar and uncouth to say the least of it; we would have thought that the General Manager would have gone in the Caboose, so as to make all the room possible for his passengers rather than crowd all the 1st class passengers into the 2nd class coach while he alone occupied that which the people paid for. It is only a country like this that such things can happen. This would be actionable at law in other countries. Mr. Mullins knows well that he dare not do this in more advanced countries. These are the sort of actions which create such an antipathy by the people for the Company which Mr. Mullins represents, as day by day he gets more intolerable to the public.

## STRIKES AND THEIR EFFECTS

In every journal the world over we read of strikes among all sorts and conditions of men and now we find the infection extended to women, as evidenced by the strike now in process in the clothes making and other departments of the women labour bureau of New York.

It has now gone one point further, it has planted itself among the police, for by the latest cables we find that the entire Police Force of Copenhagen, Denmark are on strike for higher wages, and this feeling has pervaded the entire country.

How strange it is that the capitalists and ruling powers will not realize that the unfortunates through whose labour they amass their fortunes from day to day, are being paid just sufficient to keep them from begging, meantime they roll in wealth and lay by millions to be enjoyed by (God alone knows whom), it is by means of these strikes that they are sometimes forced to see that better attention ought to be paid to one's servant. It is only here in Costa Rica that a genuine strike on modern lines cannot be organized, simply because the labourers are not properly instructed into the means and ways of a well constituted strike. Some time ago we saw in our midst a gentleman who gave appearances of being just such an organizer, he travelled throughout the country for this purpose, but finding the opportunity was not yet ripe for declaring a strike he left us for a while.

While strikes have their very unpleasant aspects and inconveniences to the public, some times even paralyzing the Commerce of a country, yet it is by these means alone that these unprincipled taskmasters can be shown that the people who help to amass the fortunes that come to their doors every year deserve a little better treatment than simply be permitted to live one grade above slavery.

It is impossible to think why it is that here in Costa Rica the labourer will not use the means at their hands for demanding better wages to cope along with the excessive cost of living. We will venture to say that in no other country in Central or South America where the cost of living is so exorbitant meanwhile the rate of wages is just the reverse, and this is well known to the authorities in charge of labour as well as to the poor labourer, hence it is our opinion that if the labourers were to form themselves into a Committee in every section and appoint a Commission of three or four of the most intelligent, honest and independent of the labouring classes, (we say independent because it would not do to appoint men whom the Coy. could ruin in business), to ask for an interview with the authorities of labour headed by a lawyer of repute, we feel sure that some amelioration to the present state of affairs would be the result, rather than give recourse to such an undesirable stage, as a "call out" to demand better wages and possibly shorter hours than heretofore.


