"No name" Controversy.

We have received a letter from Mr. Moses Samuel Samuels of Pacarito, in which he explains that, as one of the men contracted here to build the Railroad to San Jose somewhere in the far back 'eighties', in keeping with the promise which was made by Mr. Keith to either take them back home or give them lands on which to settle. He among others was placed on this "no name" land at Pacarito by Mr. Keith and Mr. Runnebaum on the completion of the Railroad with the orders that he should pay no rent whatever, he has since settled on the land and lived there for 21 years with his wife and children and to his surprise he finds Mr. Joseph Davis of the same place, who also seem apparently one of the privileged settlers, but seeing (an opportunity to make a few easy dollars and become an officer of the Coy., is not slow to grasp the chance) now demanding rental from him for his home while Davis's actions are quite in keeping with the causes of our existence in Costa Rica, yet it seems he should go easy with such privileged old servants of Mr. Keith.

We would advise Samuels and all in his position to wait on Mr. Chittenden and lay their cases intelligently and respectfully before him, and we are sure that in his pacific mode of acting, he would give them all the justice coming to them on the strength of Mr. Keith's promise, which is well recognized all over the country and it is also well known that he is never the man to make a promise which he did not intend to be carried out; and especially now that he has his great Pan American Railway scheme on hand, we believe he would not like to know that his old friends who served him faithfully and well in the times when the Jamaican negroes had to work and wait on him at times several months for their wages. The present Administration may not be aware, why that element had so many concessions from Mr. Keith and are always so glad to wish for his coming. The country is healthy today and all sails smoothly to admit chair cars and bull headed cars, but in the old days when it rained 365 days in the year, and yellow fever, black water fever and almost all sorts of diseases were household words, and what with stockholders and capitalists fearing to advance their monies, due to the fact that conditions looked so black for the completion of the road, few men but Mr. Keith would have been able to pull through and not go bankrupt, it was due to the fidelity of his labourers who waited on him at times for months only getting their rations to keep them going, that this enormous task was executed, hence Mr. Keith's lasting gratitude to these people, and the causes of so many concessions, and we are sure that he would not like to know that his present administration evades them.

New Judge.

We notice that Don Evarardo Gomez, Civil Judge of Limon has been transferred from Limon back to San José to occupy a similar post to the one in which he served here, meantime Mr. Quesada, who occupied that position in San José has been ordered to Limon to exchange with Sr. Gomez.

Mr. Gomez ought to be pleased of his change, for in consequence of the impaired health of himself and family he has had to go to San José almost every Saturday for several weeks returning on Monday evenings, hence the office has been only executing four days work to the week, probably it is from justice to the litigants that the Judicial Department has made this change.

We wish Sr Gomez and his family renewed health and vitality in his new sphere, he has always acted here with a square deal to all coming before him. We hope also that Sr. Vargas will find Limon a pleasant station to work. He will find many people here willing to prey on his new acquaintanceship only with a hope of being served in return, but really he will never find genuine friendship in Limon except from a very special few. We wish him a very bright career in the history of the legal profession of his country among us.

Railway Extensions.

Mr. Keith is determined to carry out his great Pan American Railway scheme, whereby one may drive from New York to the Isthmus of Panama within a few years hence. He has formed a new company named The International Railway Co. with a capital of ten million dollars preference 5 per cent shares and thirty million dollars of ordinary shares, and it is proposed to issue 30 millions of first mortgage stock at 5 per cent. His first idea is to connect the Railway lines of Guatemala and San Salvador which will be about 800 miles long, then he will make constructions of about 400 miles to connect Honduras, Nicaragua, Costa and Panama, then he will connect the Railways of Guatemala and Mexico, thus completing the chain from the frontiers of Mexico to Panama.

There is also a project for the consolidation of the Railways of the Argentines, Paraguay, Chile, Brazil, Bolivia and Uruguay. The principal men in these schemes are Sir William Van Horn, Dr. Pearson, Mr. Percy Farquhar and Mr. Minor C. Keith.

JAMAICA'S NEW GOVERNOR.

Every day we see changes in the Administration of the little Isle of Springs and along with those changes are not lacking complaints as to the dissatisfactions and discontentedness on the part of one section or the other of the people as to the class of men to be chosen or when chosen the line of action which that man was expected to follow, but the British Government knowing full well the habits of the people with whom they deal, simply act regardless of those complaints; for to expect that any man, no matter whom, could be appointed to fill such a position without the necessary complaints, is to ask for impossibilities to happen. When Governor Swettenham came he was much admired by the lower elements and disliked by the upper House, which helped to overthrow him in the memorable earthquake raid(?) by American marines, when he asked them to return to their ships the same as did the Nicaraguans at Leon when they came steaming up on the Railway train headed by the Stars and Stripes.

Sir Sydney Olivier came amid the applause of a few, and the discontents of almost the entire population. He remained and lived in such a manner as to call for the greatest praises from men in the financeering line of life, now we find him going with honours pretty much divided, but to say that he has done nothing for the Island as a vast concourse of people do say seem to go very far away from reality. Sir Sydney Olivier has been a great organizer and he has done much for certain departments, while there are others for which he has done practically nothing. One of his great themes seem to have been education, he made himself pretty familiar with the ways and means of the livelihood of the people under his care. He came over to Costa Rica to find out how the people existed out here. It is true that he was hurled away on the inevitable Hitchcock Car, and that he made several promises while here of which he only put one into execution,—the Parcel Post Service between here and Jamaica which will benefit all classes government and peasant alike. The Protection for Emigrants here and the like are yet to be remembered; all cannot however cannot be done in a single lifetime, and much of what may have been omitted might not have been so omitted had some of us, assisted him by a note of remembrance, by even saying something of the Guayacan Box presented him, anyhow we have many things which we can look back on, as being due to the energy of Sir Sydney Olivier. We now have to consider the arrival of the new Governor Sir William Henry Manning K.C.M.G., C.B. and to watch what department he is going to shine most resplendantly in. He is a very distinguished military man, hence he may be the means of getting Jamaica quickly garrisoned; from the little we can gather from him one can hardly judge anything, but we hope that when he does reach Jamaica he will be given all the support of the Elected members who will be in a position to fully inform him as to the needs and the requirements of the labouring classes of the people for on

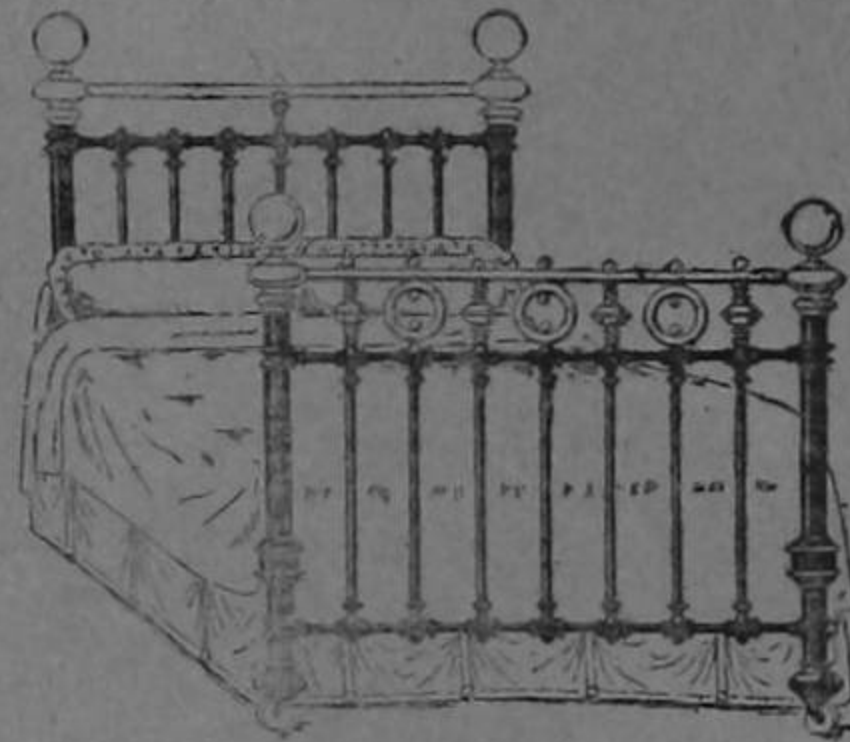
