## By Cable

### Fire at Work

Buenos Aires, Feb. 1.—A fire destroyed this morning a portion of the Archives of the Ministry of War. It started in the Public Works Office. All the furniture in both offices were destroyed.

The new Ministers for Mexico and Peru, Messrs. Ignacio Raviera and General Juan Nalberto Elisuru were officially received by the President this evening.

### Plot Discovered

A despatch from Asuncion Paraguay says that the authorities have discovered a plot to assassinate President Schafer. The Minister of foreign Affairs, Gondra, and Coronel Landa and Charris.

The police found rifles and shells in the offices of the newspaper "El Civico." The Chief Editor and others in the office were arrested.

### Castro Entrapped

Washington.—It is said that Castro will make a very short visit in the U. S. A. He declares that he feels that he is intrapped like a rat by the Immigration Authorities and that he does not answer the indiscreet questions put him by them, so as to avoid establishing a precedent, which would be equivalent to acknowledging them as international Authorities of Immigration to clear up Civil Political and Criminal matters of the Nations.

### Steamer in Distress

Manila.—The steamer Cincinnati left in tow of the British steamer Yingshow which was found in distress near the Island of Luzon. She carries 200 passengers and belonged to the Chinese Navigation Coy. All were saved.

### New Term For President

Washington.—The question of a term of six years for the Presidents of the U. S. A. is being discussed in the Senate. Senator Cummins argued much in favour of it. He contends that the Presidents will be better able to comply with their effective.

News were received by the State Department from the Ambassador in Constantinople, that the Bulgarians are preparing to start hostilities anew, on Monday night, the time for the Armistice ends.

The Bulgarian Minister of Foreign Affairs has notified all the Powers that the sea of Marmara has been thoroughly mined wherever occupied by them.

### Greeks and Bulgarians ready for War

London.—News from Sofia this evening says that Bulgarian troops under the orders of Savaoff are actively preparing to renew the attack on Adrianopolis, Montenegro, and

Greece exercise similar rights in Scutari and Janaki to that which the Bulgarians do in Adrianopolis. It is semi officially affirmed that their demands are backed up by the aid of the triple Entente at least that of France and Russia.

Dr. Streit, Greek Minister to Vienna, left London today to occupy his post. On boarding the train, he said that their reasons for renewing the war is because the peace negotiations which have failed, has been more expensive than the war,

for the costs of maintaining the armies in warfare trim has gradually been draining the resources of the allies, costing Greece alone a million daily, and Bulgaria \$60,000 meaning the Turks have been playing their games of delays and delays, with the hope of exhausting their means.

The renewal of negotiations is at present impossible, but I hope to return and sign the treaty when the fate of Turkey is sealed.

## A Brutal act. By an apparent Suffragette.

Mr. C. Knautt, called on us on his return from Parismina, and informed us that the woman in charge of the Hundrieser Farm, of Messrs. Hundrieser Bros of 7½ Miles. Rio Peje, acted towards a party of travellers passing through that farm on Monday morning 3rd inst., at 3:30 in the most barbarous manner as could be possible to one born in the jungles of Central Africa.

Nothing could be compared to the abruptness of this human tigress, he said: A party of 4 passengers and a crew of 3 making a party of 7 arrived at the sawmill by the Government

Launch to await the Peje train from Siquirres at 8:30 of that morning and as is customary they went into the shed of the Sawmill to rest until daybreak, as it may well be imagined the fatigue of these poor people when it is considered that they were travelling for 46 hours in a little boat where one can hardly stretch his feet out, having to sit in one position all the while, with only two hours rest in Parismina, in company with a woman 8 months enciente suffering the tortures of such travails on the way to her family for confinement.

No sooner did the party arrive, than this Jezebel bore down on them from the dwelling of Hundrieser with a rifle in hand and her hounds and drove them off the premises in language that would have defiled the precincts of the habitations of hell, in vain did the gentlemen interpose for saving (if not themselves), but the woman in company with them from the long walk to the shed at the Railway lines about a mile away through dark, rough and muddy road at 3 o'clock, but all the pleadings were unavailing and what's more the insulting and obscene language used by her in refusing a reasonable request was worth twenty refusals. The hardships of the unfortunate woman may well be imagined when the 101 fall and stumblings along a mile of such road last 3 a.m. that morning, after having to sit in a cramping posture for 46 hours are taken into account.

The mystery is, says our informant, that Mr. Hundrieser who belongs to a most hospitable and civilized people, the German race, would condone such an uncivilized woman in charge of his farm during his absence from home.


