

Gigantic Station.

New York 1.—At mid-night the new station of the Grand Central Ry. will be opened without ceremonies. Architects and Constructors will hand over the keys of the Edifice, which is a colossal monument of modern engineering.

The great hall has a capacity of holding 30,000 passengers with a plain ceiling presenting an astronomical view being illuminated by 2,500 stars. 25,000 passengers can be accommodated easily. The switch is the largest in the world operated by a tower fitted with the signals and megaphones to announce the departure and arrivals. There is a continual ventilation of hot and cold air and immense and comfortable waiting rooms for passengers. The dimensions of the station is 672 feet long by 310 feet wide by 150 feet high. General opinion thinks it a marvellous work at engineering skill. There is nothing lacking for the quick despatch of passengers baggage and freight.

Justice in Limon.

According to a monthly magazine devoted to American affairs, (says the "Gleaner") a rumour is current that a second gigantic canal is projected through Central America to compete with the Panama Canal. The plan, it is said, will be financed by an Anglo-French corporation and backed by foreign shipowners who are dissatisfied with the action of the United States Congress in granting American coastwise steamers free tolls. It is said that the scheme originated in Berlin and European capitalists will supply the money to carry it out.

Factory girl's luck.

A telegram from Vancouver states that Mrs. Charles Vandewater, widow of a Vancouver "lumber king," who died there recently, has left her entire fortune, which is valued at \$1,400,000, to a poor factory girl named Esther Sleight, of Kingston, New York.

Mrs. Vandewater became attached to the girl two years ago when visiting at Atlantic City the famous summer resort of New Jersey. Miss Sleight was at that time a servant in one of the hotels, and was so attentive to the widow that a friendship sprang up between them, and has been maintained ever since. At present Miss Sleight, who is only 20 years of age, is employed in a cigar factory and helps to support her father and mother, who are in poor circumstances. Mrs. Vandewater had no children, and in leaving her fortune to Esther Sleight, speaks of her as the girl she regarded as a "dear daughter."—Gleaner.

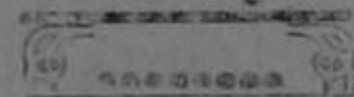

Amusing Incident Light thrown On s.s. Pastores On 'No Name'

The pride of the General Manager of the Northern Railway and U. F. Coy. was mortally wounded on Saturday evening, because of the orders of the captain of the s.s. Pastores, to the quartermaster at the gangway, not to allow anyone on board without the necessary invitation ticket, to the Banquet that was to be given. Two of the leading officers of the Shipping Department went down to the ship, and were refused admittance—they coolly walked away, but a little while after up came Mr. W. E. Mullins, expecting of course an "open sesame," he went up to the gangway, but the quartermaster obeying his orders to the letter of British discipline, refused his admission. "I am Mr. W. E. Mullins," he contended, "I do not know you sir," was the curt reply, "and my orders are not to allow anyone on board without their ticket." Finding that his name would not assist as the spring for unlocking the gate, he called an officer of the ship nearby, "of course," said the officer to his petty officer, "admit Mr. Mullins, he is an officer of the Coy.," but again the Petty officer was immovable, "pardon me sir," saluting his Chief, "I have superior orders to yours, and dare not disobey." Not until Captain Henshaw was summoned to cancel his orders, was the door thrown open to the General Manager. "You ought to exercise your discretion in these matters," said the Captain to the Petty officer. "I beg your pardon sir, I have no discretion to use, I am simply here to obey orders."

These are the little incidences that portray the rigidity of British ruling.

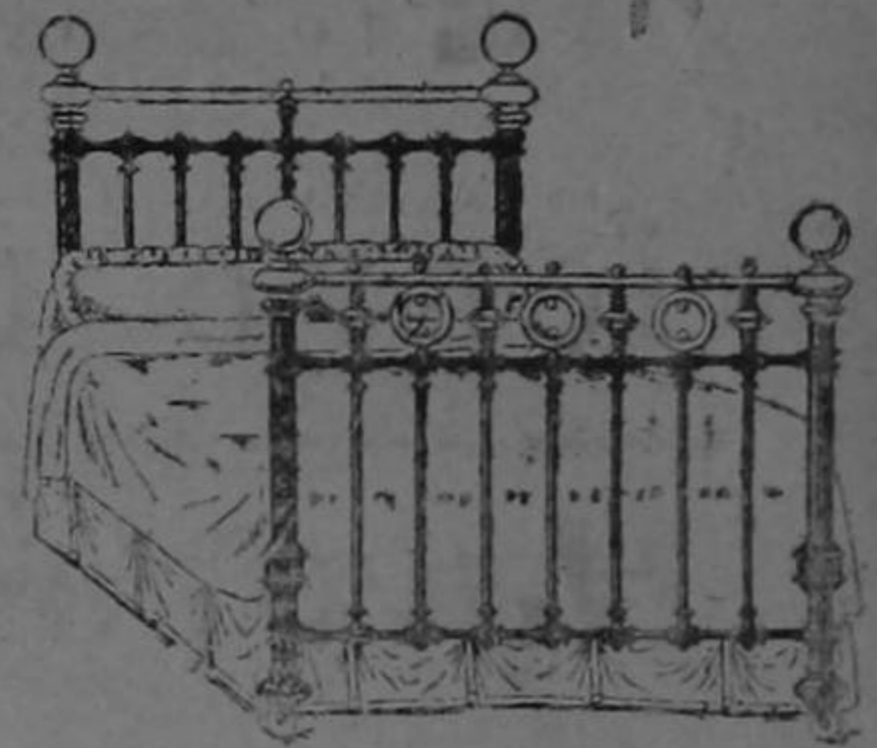
