Guacimo Notes

Our Guacimo correspondent writes:

On Sunday 9th inst., the Baptist Chapel was crowded to its utmost capacity in consequence of a function that took place. The Choirs of the Anglican and Baptist Churches officiated, as well as a few special voices by request.

The Choirs were led by Messrs. O. E. Hall and J. Hall respectively. The opening piece was a fine Anthem by the Anglican Choir, then reading of the Psalm and prayer by Mr. O. E. Hall.

The Deacon of the Chapel acted as Chairman, who gave a short address. Scripture readings were rendered by Miss Ritchie and Mrs. Forbes. A Solo and Chorus was then rendered by three little dots.

Miss Ritchie entirely captivated the house when she sang "I will go where you want me to go." She came fully up to her former standard in the old days when she led the Baptist Choir of Limon—she was encored. The Teacher, Mr. Edwards gave a short address and Mr. Demmitt rendered a Solo. A Duet was sung by Mrs. Dawkins and Mrs. Forbes. A short address by Mr. McDonald and Mr. Barnes rendered a fine Solo, "Ride on in Majesty" in fine style, the old man really brought down the house.

Mr. Kings alto was perfect in harmony in the Duet "God will take care of you."

Mr. Knott gave satisfaction in his Basso Profundo. A solo was also rendered by Miss Carr, a spirited address was given by Mr. Barnes after which a duet was rendered by Mrs. King and Miss Ritchie, "Sowing the precious seed."

The Anglican Catechist then gave a fine address after which his Choir sang an anthem, "when the roll is called I'll be there." A collection was taken amounting to 119 colones 10 cents, after which, presents were distributed among the members of the Baptist Choir and a trio was finally rendered by Messrs. Barnes, Johnson and Mrs. King, in which old man Barnes proved himself an excellent tenor voice.

The function was brought to a close with prayer, and all expressed themselves as highly satisfied, after spending a very enjoyable evening.

The National Pier was of course too small for boats of the Pastores' size, hence she had to be taken there for loading, as will all the boats of her demissions.

The Balkans.

Fighting has begun in the Balkan States again. The Bombardment of Adrianopolis is confirmed from Sofia, in a sally the Turks took 1000 Bulgarian prisoners.

The bombardment was stopped by the Servians and Bulgarians for 24 hours to allow the noncombatants to get away, after which it was commenced again with all the rigour possible, 133 small shells and 11 schrapnel fell in the town killing 8 persons and wounding 11 others.

Railway Scheme.

A contract for a scheme which will bring Montreal two days nearer to the United Kingdom, with a corresponding advantage in the case of Winnipeg and other places, (says the "Clarion" of British Honduras) has just been entered into by the Newfoundland Government. It is proposed to construct a railway eighty-five miles long between Green Bay, on the east coast, and Bay of Islands, on the west, with a view to the shortening of the Transatlantic passage. From the Bay of Islands a train ferry service will be run to Gape, 240 miles across the Gulf of St. Lawrence on the south shore. Negotiations are now in progress with several shipping companies for the inauguration of services between ports on this side of Green Bay. The passage, it is estimated, will be done in three days.

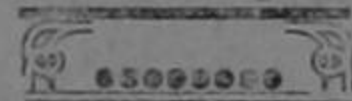

New labour Law.

"La Prensa Libre" speaks in Monday's Editorial of a project on foot for shortening the working hours of our labourers at the next session of Congress. This is a laudable move and worthy of the consideration of the entire country.

There are eight clauses to be put forward in the new law governing the working conditions of the labourer, the entire settlement of recompense in accidents during working hours.

1st, to make the working day 8 hours.

2nd, to prohibit employment of minors under 14 years

3rd, to limit the working day of youths of 14 years to six hours.

4th, to prohibit night work, except such industries that cannot avoid it.

5th, to prohibit employment of women except in special spheres.

6th, to grant a half holiday in each week.

7th, to prohibit industries which are not conducive to health.

Johnson Rebuked.

Chicago, Jan. 22.—Jack Johnson got a rebuke from Judge Carpenter in the Federal Court today, when he asked for a private conference to appeal for leave of absence from the jurisdiction of the court to make a vaudeville tour of New York State.

The Judge sent word from chambers that he would not see the negro or talk with him.

Johnson executed a new \$5,000 bond on the charge of smuggling a diamond into the country.

MINISTER REIGNS.

Several times have we heard of the expectancy of the resignation of Don Felipe Alvarado Minister of Finance but the rumour passed off in smoke, but now that it has come it has struck everyone with wonder, because it has come at a time when all seem peace and quietude and no one thought of the possibility of such a thing—in fact it came with such a shock that some people refused to believe it, nevertheless it has been fully confirmed. Until now, no one has been able to fathom exactly what may be the nature of the differences between himself and Don Ricardo Jimenez President of the Republic but it is only surmised that there have been personal unpleasantness between the two gentlemen during their recent excursion to Puntarenas.

It can therefore be readily imagined, the blow that this sudden resignation would cause to the Cabinet of Don Ricardo and to himself particularly.

These two gentlemen have been fast friends and Don Ricardo has always apparently had the most sincere confidence in the Administration of Don Felipe over the important Department which he commanded, and well he might, because Don Felipe's experience in the Commercial life of the country and particularly in the Revenue service, with which he had so much to do has fitted him to cope with circumstances that few other men in the ordinary official line of life would have been able to handle, and has enabled him to detect leaks and frauds that might have been passed over repeatedly by the inexperienced man; truly Don Felipe has made a first class Administrator, he has been a credit to his country, and when we heard of his decision in this respect we thought it a pity that he should have allowed personal differences to swerve his ideas from the best interests of his country and resolve into resignation and thus marso successful a career.

We are proud however to see by the latest papers that the gentlemen have made up their little differences and that he former has withdrawn his resignation, and still retains his position as Minister of Finance.

These are the occasions when the manly principles of men are brought to bear and petty misunderstandings thrown aside so as to work together for the good of the country, this broadminded decision of Mr. Alvarado must be applauded and long may he live to prove himself a benefactor to his country and so merit the deserved praises of his countrymen in recognition of his services to them.

Train Delayed

Halifax, N. S., Jan. 24.—The master of the schooner Florence E. Getson, cabled from Colou today that the vessel was lost, but the crew was safe. The schooner was on a voyage from St. Martins for Lunenburg with salt, and was two weeks overdue.

Canal Construction

Vienna, Jan. 18.—It is rumoured that negotiations between the United States and Russian capitalists for the construction of a canal from the river Danube to the Aegean Sea have been concluded.

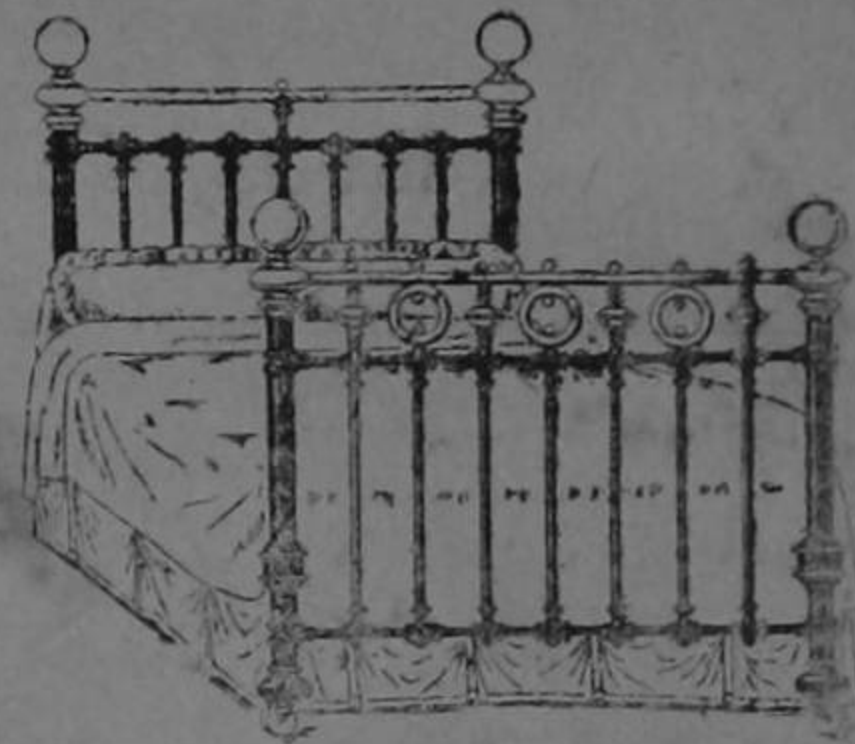
