## Ship breaks in two Great Explosion

Liverpool, Jan. 22.—The British steamship Ulstermore, from Baltimore, January 9, for Liverpool, is a wreck in the River Mersey. She ran aground today and refused assistance from a lifeboat. A heavy gale blew up, and in the high seas the vessel bumped badly.

The captain ordered the crew to jettison the cargo, and while this was in progress the steam ship broke in two and heeled over with the decks awash. The crew scrambled on the barge, from which perilous position they were rescued by a steam pilot cutter in a blinding snowstorm.

## Sunken Ship

Washington, Jan. 25.—An unidentified steamer, 250 feet long, was found in mid ocean today, bottom up, according to a wireless message received at the revenue cutter service from the British steamer Tennyson. The Tennyson said the derelict was at latitude 29 degrees 50 minutes north and longitude 65 degrees 55 minutes west. The fate of the crew is unknown.

The derelict is about 700 miles east by southeast of Cape Hatteras.

An effort will be made by the revenue cutter service to establish the identity of the sunken ship and learn the fate of the crew.

## Warns all Spies

Berlin, Jan. 25.—The Government has determined to stop flying by airships on the frontier, and the Ministry of the Interior has issued orders to the police to compel foreign aerial craft of whatever description to land and even if necessary to resort to extreme measures should an examination prove them to be Russian, and that the occupants be placed under arrest pending instructions from the Ministry to the Interior.

## Mexico in trouble.

Pres Madero has been routed from the seat of government of Mexico. General Félix Díaz has been put in power.

Ex-President Madero has fled by way of Veracruz.

General Bernardo Reyes died suddenly and his son Rodolfo killed himself when he got the news of his father's death.

**An Illegal Levy.**

By the "Gleaner" we have noticed that the levy of Mr. W. B. Parker on the goods of the "Telegraph & Guardian" against which he was awarded \$1,000 damages for unlawful dismissal as Editor, was declared illegal, and the judges decide that he could not levy on the goods of a company that was already put in liquidation. He has had therefore to pay costs in the interpleader summons.

**Don Zenon****Acquitted.**

Don Zenon Castro Rodriguez has been honourably acquitted of all responsibilities in the charges of libel placed against him by Don Maximo Fernandez, as our readers are already aware this was a charge in consequence of certain pamphlets circulated by Don Zenon Castro to the effect that Don Maximo had received moneys from Gen. Zalaya of Nicaragua to aid in the Election Campaign of Don Ricardo Jimenez. According to the evidences however, the charges have been declared unfounded.

**Fleet of the U. F. Coy.**

From the "Gleaner" we find that at the hearing of Shipping Trust question, Mr. Preston, President of the United Fruit Coy., explained to Mr. Joshua W. Alexander, Chairman of the Committee on Merchant Marine and Fisheries, that he would advise the lawyers of the Coy. to examine the "Free of Tolls" clause in the Panama Canal Act, with a view to obtaining American Registration for the Company's fleet of steamers, 81 in all, which are now being operated under the British Flag. He said he was already advised that he could not afford to accept American Registration for the ships of the British Subsidiary which holds the title for the floating stock of the United Fruit Coy.

Mr. Alexander informed him that the law provided that Foreign built ships in the foreign trade may be given American registry if they are owned wholly by Americans; and the United Fruit Coy. being in American concern, it would be to her advantage to have American Registry.

Mr. Preston curtly replied: "One of the benefits of putting the American Flag over our ship may be dissolution under the Sherman Anti Trust Law." Oh! said Mr. Alexander. "I am assuming that everything you do is legal. It is," said Mr. Preston.

**A Sleut at work**

The Editor of this Journal seem to be getting pretty valuable to the U. F. Coy. as it is understood he is in the keep of the detective department of that Coy., and is being shadowed in his movements throughout the country by its Inspector. If any foul tricks are played on his person, we hope some one will respond loudly to the call.

**Proclamation.**

Whereas the National Grand Lodge of N. America by a Proclamation dated November 1912, and received January 29, 1912, has declared the Western District Grand Lodge No. 20 L. O. of G. S. and D. S. suspended, and whereas the said District Grand Lodge No. 20 is aware of no Constitutional breach of which she has been guilty, or has been charged by the said N. G. L. she refuses to accept under protest any such mandate of suspension, declaring the action of the R. W. N. G. L. unconstitutional and grossly irregular.

Members are aware that the National Grand Lodge at its Conference held on August 11th, 1911 published, and circulated broadcast a proclamation purporting to be a final settlement of the question of Territorial jurisdiction which has for many years been a bone of contention between that Body and the W. D. G. L. No. 20. In that proclamation the N. G. L. acknowledged its error and deplored its mistake in placing a second District within the Territory covered by Charter of District No. 20 which Territory was Panama and Central America. The said Proclamation exonerated District No. 20 for refusal to send up its Charter for fear of conflicting with Laws of Jamaica."

In view of the fact that this Proclamation has never been revoked, and the R. W. N. G. L. has shown no other reason for demanding a second time the said Charter, of District No. 20. Be it resolved that the action of the R. W. N. G. L. is in the first place a violation of Article 4 and Section 15 of the Constitution of the N. G. L. governing the inauguration of Grand Lodges, and in the second a disposition to be despotic and oppressive.

Be it further resolved, that in the interest of fairplay and good government, as well as with the desire to ensure protection to members of our Order and Citizens of the British Empire scattered over the Isthmus of Panama and Central America the D. G. L. No. 20 takes steps at once to repudiate all allegiance to the N. G. L. of America, and establish its own independent government.

Subordinate Lodges under the jurisdiction of District No. 20 will be afforded every protection, and all members affectionate consideration.

Loyal members on the Isthmus of Panama and Central America are hereby enjoined to repudiate visits of any kind from members of the rival District, or any person in any way connected with the National Grand Lodge of North America.

**SIQUIRES WATER SUPPLY.**

Water is the principal need of a township and from the moment that Siquirres was declared a separate parish of the county of Limon, the Municipality has not been slow to recognize that if she is to demand the rates and taxes of a parish she must first give the people water and light, hence Siquirres has at last been served with a magnificent water supply. It was always expressed as an impossibility to have an efficient water service in Siquirres even by the leading Railroad Engineers, in consequence of there being not a sufficiency of fall in the Siquirres river, to have the head necessary for the pressure needed; but Mr. Raul Martineau, a young French Engineer made his surveys and guaranteed a good water service to the Municipality of Siquirres. He went about a mile up the river and constructed a dam from which he led his pipes, and today there is a pressure of water in the town second in comparison of volume to none in the country. Water can be had even in the three story houses of Siquirres whereas in Limon not even in the two story ones can we get water.

Mr. Martineau is to be congratulated and we hope the Limon Municipality will seek his services in procuring a good water supply rather than paying away large sums of moneys for Commissions to report on the possibilities of water, with a different version from every one.

**Mrs Arnold wins**

According to information received, we are glad that Mrs. Arnold has won her point in the attempt by the Educational Board to lay hold of a portion of her property as is already well known.

She deserves to win for she has greatly helped to make Limon. It turns out that the claim which was being made by the Board was long sold out by the very owner under whose rights they claim, and which purchase was in turn sold out to Mrs. Arnold, hence the actions by the Board was illegal. This being so, they naturally will be in for some heavy damages, by destruction of plants, fruit trees and illegal entry,

claiming ownership of their farms which they claim to possess by rights of 80 years peaceable possession as well as an inscribed Title for these farms, but rather than showing up their rights, the Superintendent Officer simply laid an embargo against their properties under the rights of ownership by gracia whereas, the people says that they owe no one anything and these gracia claims were not sold until 1906.

It is said that the farmers in that region are kindly disposed towards the Atlantic Fruit Coy. and infact were about making contracts for delivery of their fruit by Launch here to that Coy. when they closed business.

It is therefore surmised that it is in anticipation of their reappearance that these lands are being tied up.

**Siquirres****Big Lawsuits.**

Yesterday was the day set for the hearing of the fifteen million lawsuit, brought by the Bluefields Steamship Coy., against the U. F. Coy. under the Sherman Anti Trust Law, for alleged unfair means employed by the defendant Coy. in obtaining control of the former, thus destroying competition and wrecking the business of the Bluefields steamship Coy.

The Atlantic Fruit Coy. is also proceeding very seriously for dissolution of the U. F. Coy. under the Sherman Anti Trust Law, for alleged undue measures in obtaining control of the production of the bananas in these countries.

Mr. DiGiorgi got Mr. Preston to admit that his Coy. has got the control of the bananas produced in some countries, but not in all. It came out in evidence that at one time the U. F. Coy. owned 51 per cent of the shares of the Atlantic Fruit Coy., which Mr. Preston said he bought out of sympathy for the Atlantic Fruit Coy., as well as from the view of maintaining the dignity of the fruit industry meanwhile he bought these shares at \$1 dollars per share, and Mr. DiGiorgi had to pay 123 dollars per share for them when he found he was being controlled and hampered in his business.

He also proved that the U. F. Coy. ruined his credit in Costa Rica by paying one and a half million more for a cer-




