Rule Britani.

When the Canadian Parliament voted the new warships as a contribution to the Imperial Navy "we are told that members and spectators joined in singing "Rule Britania," says the "Clarion." The incident was a creditable one, not so much because of its patriotic display as from the fact that so many loyal subjects were acquainted with the words of that spirited song.

Ungrateful Murderer.

The "Gleaner" publishes the following:

A murderer named Vernet, who was under sentence of death at Coalons, is furiously angry with President Fallieres for having reprieved him.

When the governor of the prison entered Vernet's cell and informed him that he would not be executed, the murderer protested vigorously against M. Fallieres clemency, and threw a tin plate at the governor's head.

He declared that he was tired of life and of existing social conditions, and that he desired to send a petition to the president praying that he be guillotined. Vernet afterwards attempted suicide.

Mikado's Coronation.

It is freely rumoured, said the "Gleaner" of a recent date, that the coronation of the Mikado will take place in November. This is supported by the fact that the Royal Household in Tokio and Kyoto are already making active preparations.

The "Jiji Shimpou" learns from private authoritative sources that after the coronation the Emperor Yoshihito will visit Europe in fulfilment of a long-cherished wish. He will make use of a warship.

Suffragettes Mobbed.

London, Feb. 13—Mrs. Emmeline Pankhurst and some other women were mobbed at Croydon when they arrived there for a meeting last night by a crowd whose mails had been damaged by the suffragettes when they poured acids and paints into the mail boxes. The suffragettes were only saved from rough treatment by the opportune arrival of the police who had been hurriedly summoned.

New Premier.

Tokio, Japan, Feb. 12.—Count Gombe Yamamoto definitely accepted the Japanese Premiership this morning and immediately took over the duties of his office. Rioting of an extremely violent nature occurred last night at Csals, resulting in several charges by the police with drawn sabres. Many people were injured. The cause of the outbreak was the breaking up of two meetings by the police.

Lost in the Clouds.

A young French airman, M. Marcel Desoutter had an extremely exciting experience in the clouds a short time ago. He started a flight from the Hendon aerodrome at 3:40, and rose in half a gale of wind to a height of about 1,500 feet. He went off in the direction of Barne, and was expected to return in about 20 minutes.

It was not until 7:30 that the airman walked into the aerodrome. It appears that after leaving Hendon at 4:30 he reached an altitude of 3,500 feet, and then lost his way in the clouds. After circling, he saw a sheet of water which he thought was the Welsh Harp, so descended to 500 feet, and decided to land.

Reaching a field, he made a good descent at 4:45, but found that he had wandered to Gudley, some miles north of Epsom. Desoutter had been in the air 65 minutes.

Big Theft of Gold.

Vigo, Spain, Jan. 29.—A case of gold containing 100,000 marks, bound from Rio de Janeiro to Berlin, has strangely disappeared while en voyage, from the strong room of the German liner "Capblanco."

The cause is enveloped in mystery. The door was undoubtedly opened by means of a duplicate key. The captain, when he noted the loss, notified the authorities here and the ship on its arrival, was surrounded by police and Custom House launches, to prevent any possibility of the gold being taken from the vessel.

A thorough search of the vessel was then made, but it was fruitless. The missing gold was one-tenth of a shipment from Rio to Berlin.



The War in Turkey Conductor Nanne

London, Feb. 12.—A despatch from Constantinople to the "Daily News and Leader" sent via Odessa, pictures the position at the Turkish capital as becoming more extraordinary every day. Business is dead and many commercial houses have become bankrupt. The street cars stopped running long ago. Most of the steamers plying on the Bosphorus were seized for Enver Bey's expedition, and cholera is prevailing in the Asiatic shore.

It is clear daily. During a fire in the Toppach section of the city yesterday, probably started by prospective looters, there was little attempt made to check the flames except by foreign sailors. The Turks did not seem to be disturbed about it and continued to smoke away peacefully in the cafes while the flames raged furiously. Even a terrible explosion in a house which was fully of ammunition created only a mild interest.

Bananas at Auction

New York, Jan. 31.—Subsequent to April 1, the United Fruit Coy. will sell all their cargoes in New York under the auction system, instead of as at present setting the market prices according to the Coy.'s views of the market situation. This is, of course, a big innovation, and while a great many of the trade think it a good thing that the United fall in a line with the other Companies and sell at auction, and believe that by their doing so the market will be steadied and a more uniform basis of values established, there are some others who believe that the old plan had its advantages, and that under its working, the buyer got the full benefit of market conditions prevalent at the time.

There is also talk that the United intend to abolish the giving of brokerage, and that the Atlantic and the Cuneo Importing Coy. will follow suit. Under the plan at present prevalent, the brokerage of 5 cents a hundred is paid. Many of the banana brokers say that the cutting out of the brokerage will work a great hardship on them because their trade has always been accustomed to their representatives in New York getting their brokerage from the selling end and, and it is going to be an almighty hard job to get the interior buyer to come around to paying the brokerage himself.

Estrada Note.

The Railway Authorities have built a fine shed at Estrada in which passengers are supposed to wait for the train but they might take it into consideration and place a bench of some sort on which passengers may have a seat while waiting for the train.

Let us beg Mr. Mullins to be a little more considerate for the feelings of the travelling public.

Anyone looking around may not be led to conjecture that Limon has really been built up within the last fourteen years. Formerly it was only an immense swamp where one had to walk on planks to avoid getting up to your waist in mud, but due to the keen foresight of Don Rafael Yglesias, Limon is what it is today.

We have heard of some enormous bribes by certain parties to certain lawyers and certain parties have even gone to Jamaica to look up the relatives of these parties, all because the value of the lands today have so increased as to cause all sorts of business propositions to be made.

If any of the relatives of Anna Forbes will communicate to this Journal, they will learn fully of the above which may mean thousands of dollars to them. Such incidents are the consequence of the improvements of any place and Limon is no exception; and not alone has the town of Limon prospered during this time, but the entire province. 


