## Governor's Divorce Case.

From the "Gleaner" we take the following:

The "New York Herald" of the 4th February published the following cable, as a special despatch from their Bureau in London, dated Monday, 3rd February:

Sir William Manning, at one time Governor of Nyassaland protectorate, and now Governor of Jamaica, is suing for a divorce, citing Captain Llewellyn his aide-de-camp as co-respondent.

The parties were married in 1910 and went to Nyassaland. In the latter part of last year his wife returned to England to avoid the hot weather, and subsequently she telegraphed to Sir William, saying that after long thought she believed their life together was a great mistake and she had gone away with Captain Llewellyn, with whom alone she could be happy.

Sir William is to leave for his new post on February 22nd, and the case which was undefended, was advanced to enable him to give evidence before leaving the country.

## Bill Rejected.

London, Feb. 12.—The House of Lords last night rejected the Welsh Disestablishment Bill 252 to 51. Thus its fate is identical with that of the Home Rule Bill. It must be passed by two succeeding sessions of the House of Commons before it can become a law.

## Appeal Denied

Washington, Feb. 3.—The right of Jack Johnson, the pugilist, to appeal to the Supreme Court from the decision of the Federal Court in Chicago refusing him bail under a white slave indictment, was denied today by the Supreme Court of the United States.

The court dismissed Johnson's appeal without passing on the validity of the Mann "white slave" law, under which the pugilist was indicted. The court held that Johnson had been admitted to \$20,000 bail after the appeal was taken, and that as he had secured relief it was not necessary to pass upon the motion. The decision leaves Johnson facing trial out on bail but with the "white slave" law still under attack in the high court.

## Topical Medicine

The "Gleaner" publishes the following:

The Council of the University of Liverpool, on the 20th ult., appointed Dr. J. W. W. Stephens to Sir Alfred Jones Chair of Tropical Medicine, vacant through the resignation of Sir Ronald Ross. Dr. Stephens, prior to this appointment, held the Walter Myers Lecture-ship in Tropical Medicine, and has been associated with the teaching work of the Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine for ten years.

## Spanish Morocco.

Madrid, Feb. 13.—The Spanish Cabinet yesterday proclaimed a military protectorate over Spanish Morocco. Representatives of France, Great Britain and Spain will assemble in Tangiers shortly, to fix an agreement for the neutralization of Tangiers.

## A train full Without Orders

It has come to our knowledge that a Conductor of the Northern Railway Co., who had orders to run to Madre de Dios and await orders there on Sunday last, got impatient to await further, and took his chances to Siquirres without orders. He was however lucky enough to make Siquirres without meeting any accident. Himself and the Engineer have been dismissed from service.



## Mrs. Arnold's

## Lands.

The matter of Mrs. Arnold's lands adjoining the St. Mark's Church and the lands of the Church and the Railway lines passing there, seem definitely settled now.

From what can be gathered, these lands were bought from a man who owned them under Registered Title without himself even knowing it to be sold to Mrs. Arnold, who bought out his rights of an inscribed document from the former owner, without knowing it herself now that the trouble has come about, searches have been made, and the fact has been revealed that there existed originally a Registered Document for this land which has passed in due time into the hands of Mrs. Arnold, the claim therefore of the Board of Education is unfounded and it is understood that a claim of 100,000 colones is to be put against the Board by Mrs. Arnold, for damages which she has suffered by their rash act. It is claimed that the mental agony which this poor lady has been occasioned, is worth every inch of the amount claimed. She has been besieged and assailed night and day by the people to whom she sold the lots, and one has gone so far as to charge her criminally for selling lands to which she knew she had no title or would get no title, but this case has been nonsuited.

We also understand that she goes to Jamaica to put on the finishing touches of International reasonings in the matter. It is well therefore that these persons who have refrained paying her during the disturbance, now rush forward and pay her their dues.

## Church wrangles

From rumours we have heard on the streets, the strain between the Acting Rector of St. Mark's Church and the congregation, is not very agreeable, and if His Lordship does not take steps to investigate into the causes and adjudicate on the rumours afloat, there will soon be no church.

The members of the Church Committee are expecting an audience with the Bishop, but it is feared that they will not have it, from the fact that they requested the Rector to invite His Lordship at their last meeting, but he failed to do so although he said that the Bishop asked to be excused on the grounds of being tired, of which excuse His Lordship knew nothing.

If these matters are not threshed out, we would not be surprised to see the Committee resign in a body.

We also learn that there is no Treasurer on the Committee but that the Rector is Treasurer now so long as the Ven. Archdeacon Robinson remained, his being Treasurer was understood as the funds were raised by him for the support of the Church, but a Treasurer ought now to be appointed since a new Committee is formed.

## CAPTAIN SCOTT'S FATE.

Never for a long time has the public been confronted with such a narrative of pathetic suffering as that explained by the latest reports by the cables of the unfortunate death of Captain Scott, the late intrepid Antarctic explorer.

As is shown by documents found in the Camp where he died, he reached the South Pole on the 18th January, just one month after Capt. Amundsen the Norwegian explorer did

While deplored the sad fate which overtook the little party, the bravery, honesty, generosity and endurance of the Englishman stand out in bold relief, and every British heart may rightly be proud of the conduct of the party.

In the first instance, the least of the party, Evans the sailor met an accident on the way home which rendered him incapable of travel, hence the party had to camp and nurse him, and in spite of the fact that everyday to them carried its vital consequences, fully realized by them, due to their shortness of provisions, yet they remained and nursed him to the end. He died, and they then proceeded on their journey. On their way out another of the party fell ill, Capt. Oates, due to the severe exposure to the snow storms never before heard of, again the party had to stop to nurse him until one day Capt. Oates fully realizing what every moment's delay to nurse him meant to his comrades, walked deliberately out into the blizzard, saying he would be away for some time, he knew full well that he was walking into certain death, and all the persuasions of his comrades would not deter his intention as he was determined to give them every possible chance of saving themselves, he walked away and died.

The party proceeded a bit farther, but was prevented from travelling by the tempest that arose, they had then to make their last camp out, where the rest of the party died from hunger and exposure just within eleven miles of the large camp provided with necessities.

Picture the feelings of Capt. Scott to reach the goal and only by the remann's life behind him his rival had got there long ahead of him, yet jealousy did not lead him to do otherwise than register his own defeat in his diary.

His conduct all through his trials and sufferings is exemplary and serves as a series of lessons, for many men in his position knowing the dangerous situation in which he was placed, would not have waited so patiently on his sick comrades, but rather would have left them behind to take their chances and he took his to reach a place of safety which was only eleven miles ahead of where he succumbed to his awful fate. His last appeal however is the one which strikes us to the heart, for he implores the Empire not to forget giving the hand of help and fellowship to the families of those who were dying for the Empire's Honour. Think of the amount he said that would have been spent in honouring him, had he survived to take home his report let this amount be turned over to the families of himself and companions who had lost their means of sustenance in this terrible misfortune.

Too often do we see the families of men in all stations of life who have lived and died as heroes of some great cause for the benefit of others, go unprotected forgotten, thus bringing a curse where otherwise there should have been a blessing.




