Cables.

Bogota, Feb. 21—The papers publish that Colombia has rejected the latest offer of the United States to settle the question with Panama. She will await President Wilson's regime, under which better advantages are hoped for.

Albany, 21—Dr. Russell, Superintendent of the State Hospital Mattewan, made a statement before the investigation of Sulzer that he has offered twenty thousand dollars to retire Thaw, but he did not give the name of the New York lawyer who made the proposition.

New York, 21—The World Street Journal publishes an interesting article on the financial question in Mexico, expressing that the pessimistic view held by the financiers relative to the situation, has disturbed exchange. Deposits were immediately made to satisfy the guarantees in the hands of the United States, and the Treasury Bonds falling due on 1st June and 1st September.

Washington, 21—Notwithstanding the contradictory rumours, Bryan will be Secretary of State.

The Perkins Bill before the Senate provides for an appropriation of 150 millions to various San Francisco Expositions.

The Economic Democrats will oppose the naval bill of 1,500 millions for construction of new cruisers.

Tonight will be the last reception held at the White House, there will be a banquet and entertainment. The intimate friends of Mrs. Taft will present her with a diamond necklace.

The American Government intimated to the Mexican Government through Ambassador Wilson, that she will oppose seriously the execution of ex-President Madero. Wilson repudiated that he will be tried legally in accordance with the laws of the country; but later news states that while he was being conveyed from the Palace to the Penitentiary, an attack was made on the escort conveying him, and a fight ensued, in which five persons were killed among them being President Madero and ex-Vice President Pino Suarez.

San Francisco, 21—The exposition will be officially inaugurated with 2 years. Works are proceeding rapidly, 8 nations will participate.

The Suffragettes.

Mrs. Emeline Pankhurst has informed the police that she is personally responsible for the explosion in the residence of Mr. Lloyd George, consequently steps are being taken to indict her criminally for the offence.

Mrs. Faucett, President of the Suffragette Association, censured severely the criminal conduct of the women now in Congress. She denounces their actions as "loitering on to savagery, and a menace to civilization."

Police Case

At Rio Peje.

We have information from Cairo Branch that one Hindu at 5 Miles was, had enough to purposely visit where 4 or 5 respectable married women were bathing in the river at a most secluded spot, and when chased away for his depravity, he reported to the Agent of Police that these women were bathing at a public place, who fined them all 5 colones and 75 cents, without further investigation.

Now we have it an good authority that the place was over 200 metros from the nearest house and fully secluded by the growth of trees and bushes, hence the Police should have fined Hynds for disturbing these women, rather than trade on their ignorance of the Customs and Laws; nor do we think that the Towns and Communities Act under which this offence would fall, extends to such out of the way places as 5 Miles.

It would be well if our esteemed Jefe Politico, Don Antonio Arguedas at Siquirres would send Don Pablo Boza to acquire into this complaint, as these are the little wrongs that bear heavily on innocent people and at times lead to crimes of enormous consequences.

Another President Is Missing.

On Monday, Mr. C. Bryan of the defunct Labourers Union here, was seen hustling down to the ship with three policemen and when asked why, it was discovered that he was in search of Mr. D. Briscoe, ex-president of the Union, against whom a summons had been issued for non-accounting for certain funds of the Union. The Prinz Joachim was searched from tip to toe, but to no purpose, he was seen on the ship on Monday and supposed to have gone aboard on Sunday night—But he is gone.

The Great Ditch.

From Panama the latest cables announce that the recent slides in the Culebra cut, aggregate the amount of Excavations made to 5,634,161 cubic yards. The total amount of excavations in the cut was as calculated at 5,842,295 cubic yards, but with the continual slides the estimates have risen to 9,956,817 cubic yards.

The total amount of yardage of the Canal is 218 millions of which about nine tenths have already been removed. Ninety one per cent of the concrete for the Gatun dams have already been laid down, while the slides have delayed the works in the centre of the ditch works in extremities have progressed very rapidly.

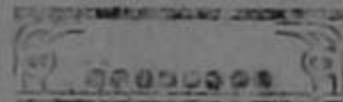

Voices of The Union

This is to notify all financial members of the Defunct Artisans and Labourers Union:

Be it known that it was decided by the Civil Judge of Limon on the 9th day of December 1912 that the Society of Artisans and Labourers, was and is the Artisans and Labourers Union of Costa Rica, and that the amount of 9000 colones that was deposited in the Commercial Bank of Costa Rica, be liquidated.

The decision of the Court is to be duly published for three months in succession, the first publication having appeared in the Gazette of the 6th of January 1913

At a recent meeting held before the Court on Wednesday February 26th 1913, for the appointment of a Liquidator, Don Ricardo Mora Fernandez, the Municipal Treasurer, was unanimously appointed to fill the position.

Further notification is hereby given that members who were not more than three months in arrears, when the Society became defunct in December 1912, to submit forthwith their cards to the Secretary to be recognized, and entered with a green mark before approaching the Liquidator. No Card is considered valid or worthy of payment without this mark and signature of the Secretary, as the result of a raid that was made on the goods and chattels of the Society by members of the Limon crossing on March 7th 1911, when volumes of cards were seized and taken away.

Further notification is hereby given to the Public. Whoever having claims against the Society, to furnish the Secretary a copy as well as the Liquidator, as it is only such claims that can be specified by him or the Legal Representative Mr. Joe, E. Davis, that will be sanctioned and endorsed.

Further notification is hereby given to the individuals who seized the goods and chattels of the Society at the Limon crossing on March 7th 1911 which are as follows:—One Desk valued at \$6.00, 8 Chairs at \$4 each, 7 Benches at \$4 each, 1 Typewriter at \$100, 1 Sign Board \$2, 1 Ice Cream Bucket \$0.00, one small Desk \$1.50, 5 Flags at \$1 each, one Charity Box \$1.50, 1 Feather Duster \$1.50, 1 Inkstand \$1.50, 1 File of Letters, 1 Box Pen Nibs \$1.50, 3 New Receipt Books 75 cents each, 1 Letter Receiver with important letters, 1 Official Diary, Cash Book of Commissary, Stock Book of Commissary, two Electric Bulbs and Globes, 2 Black-boards \$2 each, 1 Book of Funeral Taxation, 1000 New Cards, 200 enrolled Cards, etc. etc.

All claims, cards and indebtedness must be rendered in to the Secretary and Liquidator not later than April 7th 1913 after which date all claims cease, and action will be taken to bring in that which is indebted to the Society.

Recent arrest by Inspector Merrill

We have just been informed that on Saturday last while Inspector Merrill was running out on his motor car, he met a man named Beckford with a horse on the track at the Crossing, he laid hold of his gun and told the man that if they continued getting in his way on the lines of this Railroad he will shoot them down. Another man who was standing by, said to Beckford: "Why do you not tell him that you do not understand him, for you do not believe that he can shoot a man as though he was a deer?" On so saying, another man named James Brown who was coming along on his business laughed at the assertion. Mr. Merrill thereupon ordered a policeman who was near by to arrest the man Brown; this was done and the man detained until 8 p.m. that night when a lawyer's assistance had to be sought to liberate the man, who appeared on Sunday morning before the Police Court and was fined 75 cents.

Is the Inspector a recognized officer of the Law, that he can order the police of the country to arrest any man he cares for any imaginary offences against him and detain such prisoner until such time he may care to lay a charge against him?

THE WAR FOR FRANCHISE.

The matter of one's franchise is the burning question of the day in every country.

In almost every newspaper, the world over, can be found narratives of how not only men but women are clamouring for their rights of franchise.

In those countries where universal franchise is not extended to the inhabitants, the fight is keener.

In Costa Rica for instance where every male child above 18 years has the right to vote, one may see more contentment among the voters, but those countries like England where that right is only partial, that is, no one who cannot prove that he is up to a certain standard of social responsibility, that is, we must pay so much in taxes, or be earning a certain salary, there's where the clamouring is more intense, and it seems as though conditions will never be better until some change is made in this respect; while on the other hand it is feared that when that change does take place, the influence of the Monarchy will cease to wield the power it does today.

If however there is anything that seem sure to happen it is that something must be done to alleviate the present strain in matters of franchise.

Day by day the war of the women are getting more fierce, and in as much as their tactics are lawless and do not tend to enhance the chances of their success, yet if we judge by the amount of sympathizers they gain year by year in Parliament and outside of Parliament, one must conclude that sooner or later they will carry their point, then it must be that the law on voting will have to be changed, and who knows what may be the result of such changes.

Bananas Prohibited On the Pier.

A most crude action came under our view on Thursday last when a few sailors from the French boat went out along the track and obtained a bunch of bananas each; on going back to the ship they were accosted by a man at the dock gate who said the United Fruit Coy. had placed him there to prohibit any one entering the dock with bananas, he then took away the fruit from the sailors, and threw them into the sea.

We do not believe that this was the intention of the Coy. if it is, then its a peculiar thing to do, because those sailors might not necessarily have got those bananas from the Coy's car. We believe however it is from the want of discretion on the part of the subordinates, and as they may have nous to use, they may be instructed to avoid these encroachments on the privileges of the public.
