Married after death Echoes of

A story is told by "La Republica," that at Shizuka in Japan, a couple was married after death.

It runs that the pair, after several refusals by their relatives to permit them to be joined in wedlock, got into a fishing boat and went out some distance at sea, tied themselves together and plunged into the sea. Their bodies were washed out on the shore, and on seeing the condition the bodies were embraced, their parents were so impressed that they decided to perform the matrimonial ceremony over the bodies, so that their spirits would be in a better state of union, in the other world.

The Ceremony was then performed and presents and compliments exchanged, the same as done when the contracting parties are alive.

Pastor Russell in Colon.

Ofcourse in Limon as the blacks are predominant in number, that ruling does not extend here, but in San Jose it does.

Pastor Russell's lectures would therefore be highly appreciated here, as right thinking men are very much undecided as to what course to adopt so far as christianity is concerned.

Castro to visit Costa Rica.

A San Jose paper says that there is a rumour to the effect that General Castro is expected here some time this month, possibly the 8th or 9th, to consult with Dr. Rivas Vasquez.

This seem far fetched, but the community would, we are sure, be pleased to welcome the famous General.

The Union

This is to notify all financial members of the Defunct Artisans and Labourers Union:

Be it known that it was decided by the Civil Judge of Limon on the 9th day of December 1912 that the Society of Artisans and Labourers, was, and is the Artisans and Labourers Union of Costa Rica, and that the amount of 5,000 colones that was deposited in the Commercial Bank of Costa Rica, be liquidated.

The decision of the courts is to be duly published for three months in succession, the first publication having appeared in the Gazette of the 6th of January 1913

At a recent meeting held before the Court on Wednesday February 26th 1913, for the appointment of a Liquidator, Don Ricardo Mora Fernandez, The Municipal Treasurer, was unanimously appointed to fill the position.

Further notification is hereby given that members who were not more than three months in arrears, when the Society became defunct in December 1910, to submit firstly their cards to the Secretary to be recognized, and endorsed with a private mark before approaching the Liquidator. No Card is considered valid or worthy of payment without this mark and signature of the Secretary, as the result of the raid that was made on the goods and chattles of the Society by members at the Limon crossing on March 7th 1911, when volumes of cards were seized and taken away.

Further notification is hereby given to the Public. Whoever having any claims against the Society, to furnish the Secretary a copy as well as the Liquidator, as it is only such claim that can be specified by him or the Legal Representative Mr. J. E. Davis, that will be sanctioned and endorsed.

Further notification is hereby given to the individuals who seized the goods and chattles of the Society at the Limon crossing on March 7th 1911 which are as follows:—One Desk valued at \$60 8 Chairs at \$4 each, 7 Benches at \$4 each, 1 Type-writer at \$100, 1 Sign Board \$2, 1 Ice Cream Bucket \$20, one small Desk \$4, 3 Flags at \$1 each, one Charity Box \$1.50, 1 Feather Duster \$1.50, 1 Inkstand \$1.50, 1 File of Letters, 1 Box Pen Nibs \$1.50, 3 New Receipt Books 75 cents each, 1 Letter Receiver with important Letters, 1 Official Diary, Cash Book of Commissary, Stock Book of Commissary, two Electric Bulbs and Globes, 2 Black-board \$2 each, 1 Book of Funeral Taxation, 1000 New Cards, 200 enrolled Cards, etc. etc.

All claims, cards and indebtedness must be rendered in to the Secretary and Liquidator not later than April 7th 1913 after which date all claims ceases, and action will be taken to bring in that which is indebted to the Society.

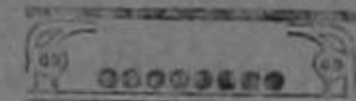

Life Insurance.

To Members of the Defunct Union

We notice that the Jamaica Mutual Life Assurance Society is making rapid strides here since Mr. Spencer Thompson, the travelling Agent of that Coy., came here.

Mr. C. G. Smith his local representative has been doing yeoman service for the Coy along the lines, hundreds of the labouring population have been induced by Mr. Smith to insure their lives. This is the country where life insurance should really be indulged in as circumstances are so changeable and unexpected here.

Mr. Cecil Lindo is the most heavily insured man in Costa Rica, he is insured in one and a quarter million dollars gold, Don Cleto Gonzalez comes second with 100,000 colones and Don Maximo Gonzalez third with 80,000.

This is the last meeting at which any opinion can be expressed.

A Fine Building

One cannot help noticing as he passes by the new building at 2nd street and 3rd avenue, how peculiarly it is being constructed.

The lower floor is made of bricks, the main body of which is eight inches thick, whereas the upper story is made of first class concrete reinforced with heavy wire meshing and iron rods, the flooring and roofing are done with heavy iron joices covered with the same concrete.

In our mind the brick on the base cannot stand the weight of the concrete on top; it is a pity the owner did not think of putting the concrete below; then he would have had a magnificently constructed house. In case of a heavy shock of earthquake, to which we are so much subjected here, the weight of the stronger materials on top may result in fearful consequences to him, otherwise, this building is a great improvement to that section of the town and a grand impediment in the progress of fire.

Sacrilege Committed.

The Church at Guadalupe was broken into and all the valuables stolen therefrom, as well as what moneys were found. All the sacred ornaments were thrown on the floor and broken.

The police were informed, but no clue has yet been found.

Episcopal Notes

All the Ministers of the Church of England in Costa Rica are in Limon:

The Revs. Cook from San Jose, Trott from Gerania, and Lorde from Estrada; all came down with His Lordship on Tuesday evening.

What does the gathering mean, is it due to the storm cloud hanging over the St. Mark's Church?

The Rev Cook has been appointed Bishop's Commissary here.

Attempted Robbery

Three thieves painted themselves with blacking, attempted a robbery at the Tobacco Factory in San José. They were surprised by the guard, whose cries for help brought out neighbours and police, who fired at the thieves, but they escaped replying to the shots.

DEMOCRATIC DAY.

The 4th of March, 1913 passed off in Limon as though nothing had transpired, inasmuch as it is the day on which the dominating government of the West would change, and has changed not only its Chief Magistrate, but its form of government.

It is truly surprising that not only the American citizens here, but the Costa Rican democrats, have been as reticent and nonchalant as they have been. Of course we may judge that the majority of Americans here, are partisans of the former government, hence those in the minority did not care to identify themselves with the movement, but knowing as we do know, that all the Latin American countries, hope for greater equanimity and freedom in their personal privileges with the advent of the Democratic Government of Mr. Woodrow Wilson, which is borne out by the fact, that from time to time they have always spurned at most of the propositions and details of the Dollar Policy. We had thought that even the Flags would have been flown in honour of the occasion, however, this might have been avoided from diplomatic reasons.

This day ought truly to be a day of rejoicing for the Democratic party from the fact that after so many years of continual defeat, the day has arrived when by their determined efforts, their good judgment in the choice of their Candidate, as well as the confidence of the American Nation in the rectitude of Mr. Wilson, their efforts have been crowned with success in the ascension to power of possibly the only man who would vanquish the forces of the Republican Party.

His manifesto evinces great forethought, and if carried out as we expect they will be, will be sure to secure for the American people, the respect and confidence which seem to have been waning, in consequence of the peculiar tactics put forward by the expansion policy of the former government.

An exorbitant Fine.

Mr. Walter Smith of New Jersey, 27 Miles, begs to inform the public that from time to time Mr. Carmona, the Inspector of Hygiene has been taking no end of impositions of him, but the last one beats all records. He complains that he owns a little house at 27 Miles, and because the house was not painted, Mr. Carmona comes along and imposes on him a fine of 30 colones because he is rich and sends him to Matina to the Judge there; when he went to Matina, the Judge finds that the fine is exorbitant and reduces it to 15 colones and orders him to paint the house in 30 days.

Now as far as we know of the law, in this matter, whenever the Municipality decrees that owners must paint their houses, the alternative is generally that if the houses are not painted within the time stipulated that the Municipality does the work at the expense of the owners, but it does seem as if Mr. Carmona is stretching the law to suit his own purposes simply because he gets 20 per cent of the fines imposed on these poor people.

It would be well that the authorities investigate these matters.

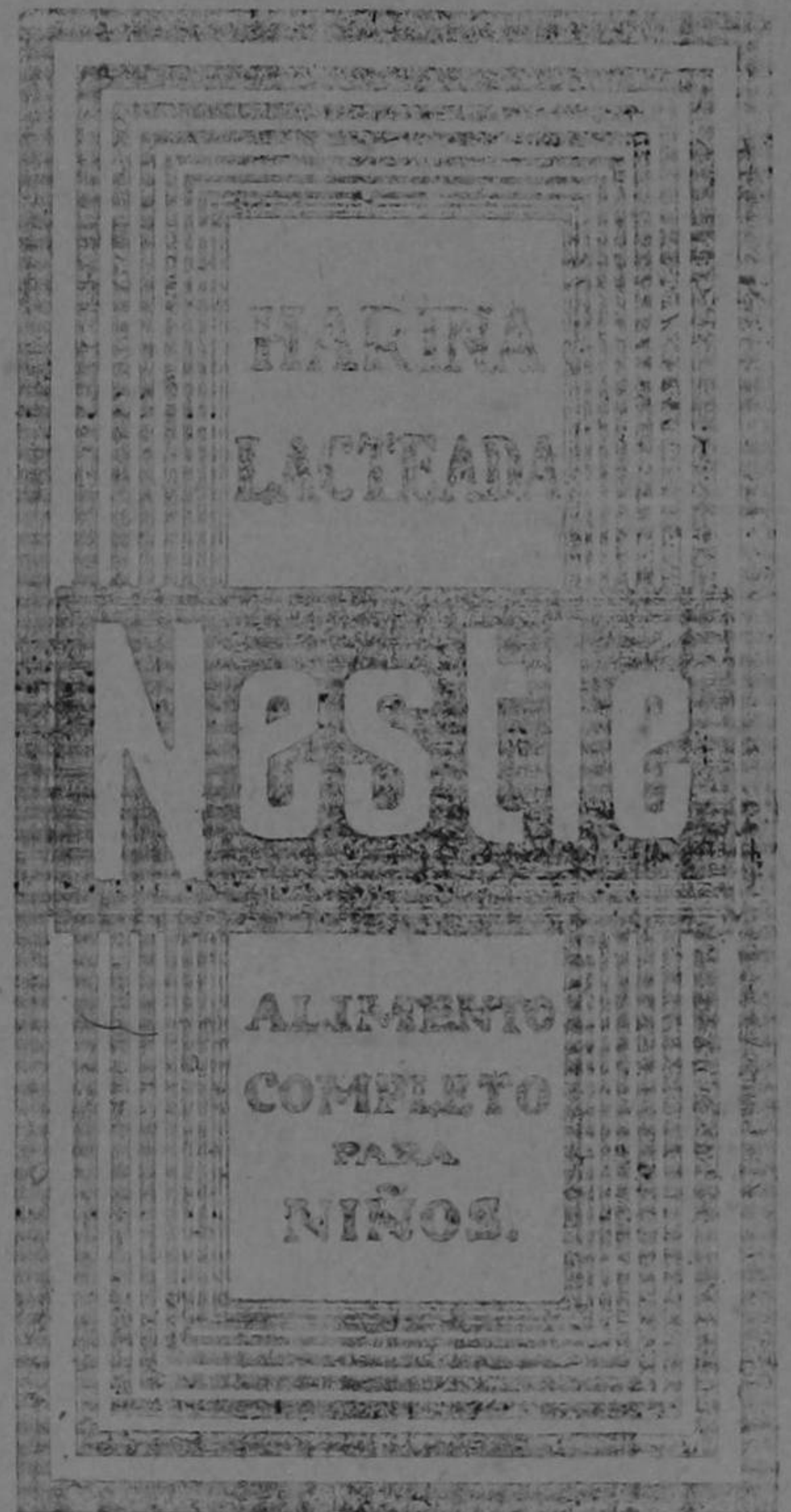

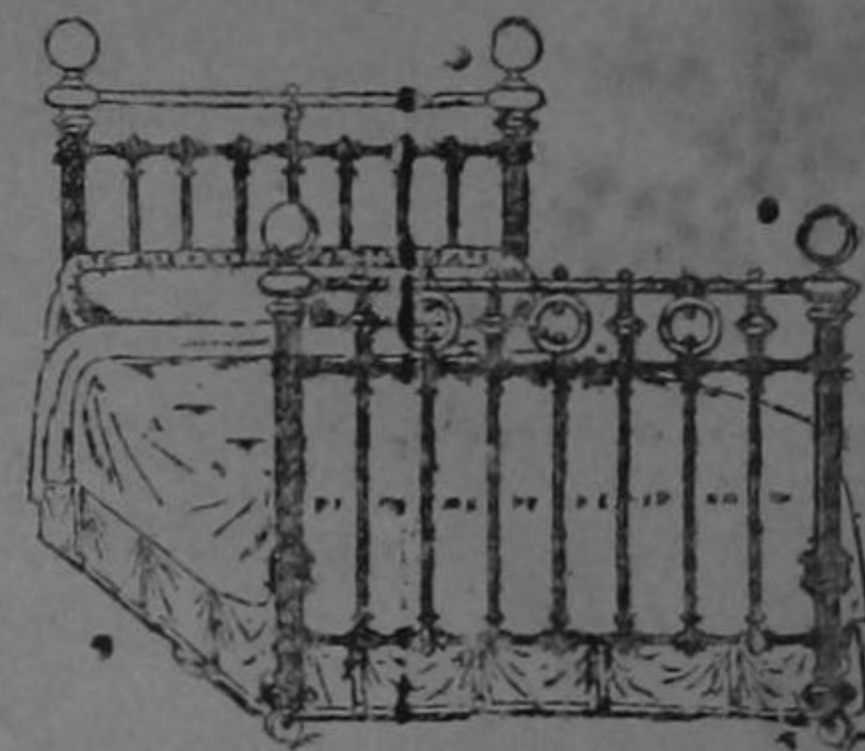
